REGISTER IT!

If your property is stolen make sure you can describe it to the police by keeping a record of makes, models and unique serial numbers by registering the details onto www.immobilise.com

www.immobilise.com is a web based property records system, endorsed and searchable by all UK Police Forces and can help ensure stolen property can be identified whilst helping to bring offenders to justice.

Get your electricals and treasured possessions close to hand, go online and visit www.immobilise.com

Create an account following the simple instructions, before adding property details including unique serial numbers for free.

If possible also mark your postcode and house number onto property with a UV pen and register these details onto the website.

If anything you've logged goes missing, inform the police and update it as lost or stolen on www.immobilise.com to help police recover and return your property.

TRACK IT!

Software is available that allows you to locate your stolen laptop or Android mobile. Alternatively it can record what is being viewed on your screen or take a picture on the camera which can help identify the location of the property or the person in possession of it.

Some software programmes have a small charge like mobile phone Apps, but there are also downloadable programmes which are free for laptops. Search on the web for "free laptop tracking programmes".


