

Our New Bus Route

The new 150 service runs Tuesdays & Thursdays for a trial period until 2022.

The circular loop starts at Ferriby High Road.

It goes around Ferriby and Monks Way Melton, up to Swanland and then onto Hessle and Sainsbury's Supermarket.

There is sufficient time between journeys for shopping in Hessle and Sainsbury's

It returns to Ferriby via Ferriby High Road.

Note that you cannot come directly DOWN from Swanland

GP Surgery at the Village Hall – decision delayed

The Parish and Ward Councillors were consulted by NHS England on the proposed closure of the Hessele Grange branch surgery at the Village Hall. The PC response is available to view on the PC website.

A decision will not now be made by the East Riding Clinical Commissioning Group until the consultations on this closure and the proposed closure of the Swanland surgery have been considered by East Riding Council's Health, Care & Wellbeing Overview & Scrutiny Committee on 22nd September

Ferriby Village Hall's doors are open even wider, with familiar and regular clubs and societies increasingly holding their meetings there. We've received many enquiries for parties and social events in the months ahead and discussions with hirers ensures that their event can happen in line with their wishes and our latest guidelines on safety, as infection rates remain high.

We have replaced our temperamental boiler, which will be an asset in colder months and the upgrade to our garages, with new watertight roof, new wiring and electric roller doors, is nearly complete.



We have noticed continued unauthorised use of the front parking spaces. This was something we were prepared to turn a blind eye to during lockdown, as the Hall was not in use. However, with the Hall used most days, we have found unauthorised vehicles parking in spaces needed by those with mobility issues who need to park as close to the doors as possible. We would be grateful if members of the public would only use these spaces when they are attending an event at the Hall.

The Committee is working with Mires Beck Nurseries to develop a management plan for **Riverside Walkway** – keep an eye on the Parish Council website. Overhanging hedges and trees Now is a good time to check your hedges and trees to ensure they are not encroaching onto the footpaths outside your home and creating difficulties for pedestrians, particularly those with reduced mobility or pushing prams and buggies.

RIP Wendy Dobbs

The Parish Council is sad to report the passing of former Parish Councillor **Wendy Dobbs** who served the village since the 1960s until fairly recently. Wendy's passion was the environment and she played a leading role in the acquisition of the former landfill site, which is now **Riverside Walkway**. Her interest in the Ferriby Bronze Age boats, along with other parish councillors and members of the community, resulted in the construction of the half-scale replica of the Bronze Age boat which was displayed in Coronation Gardens two years ago, and in the boat pavement which is on the Walkway.
