The East Riding Local Plan has now been formally adopted by East Riding Council and that confirms that there will be additional housing to the east of the village.

The Parish Council feels that there is a need for specialist accommodation for over 60s and that the land to the east of the War Memorial would be a suitable position.

If you might be interested in either an apartment or bungalow in that location **it is important that you let us know so that we can try to influence what goes on that land**, either write to or email the Clerk as soon as you can.

At the time of printing there is still no news on whether St Modwen plc is able to take their application for housing on Melton Fields to the Court of Appeal. The Parish Council website will be updated when we hear.

Can you contribute to the lives of children in care?

EYRC Children's Participation and Rights Team is looking for volunteers to join the Independent Visitor (IV) Scheme.

This is a befriending and mentoring role supporting children and young people who are in the care of the local authority. IVs are carefully matched with a young person from similar backgrounds and who enjoy similar activities.

IVs meet with their young person once or twice a month, to take part in trips and activities. This one to one relationship can involve anything from bowling and the cinema, to kicking a football in the park.



The IV is a friend, mentor and/or advocate to the young person depending on their individual needs – most importantly the IV and child just have some fun! Anyone over the age of 18 can volunteer with the scheme. Volunteers do not need any formal qualifications but do need to be able to relate well to children and to have a genuine interest in the welfare of young people.

They also need to commit to visiting a child or young person for at least two years. In return IVs receive on-going training and support as well as receiving agreed expenses.

IVs are required to have a DBS check. If you would like further information, please ring 565 560.

Crime Prevention Advice from Humberside Police

Prevention of bicycle thefts

In the neighbouring areas there has been an increase of bicycle thefts.



Keep bicycles locked at any time they are left unattended with a good quality lock.

Prior to leaving the bicycle check the lock by pulling at it to ensure it is secure

Use an engraver to place an identifying mark on an unpainted component of the bicycle.

Be able to identify the bicycle by its features, take close up pictures of the cycle.

Register the cycle with www.immobilise.com

Prevention of shed/garage burglaries Neighbouring areas have seen a high number of shed and garage burglaries, over the summer months. It is possible to prevent yourself becoming a victim, by considering:



Fit good quality locks, with the hasp bolted through the shed and into a steel plate.

Securing garage doors with padlocks to inside runners, or either side of the doors outer edges

Checking windows are secure and in a good repair

Obscuring windows to prevent thieves seeing through.

Replacing any rotten wooden areas to prevent entry.

Locking high value items together and to an immovable object.
