Ferriby Remembers

Plans for the Village Remembrance event to commemorate 100 years since the end of WW1 are progressing well. Support for the **Knitted Poppies Project** has been overwhelming, but we ask that no further poppies now be knitted to allow the Knit and Natter group to concentrate their efforts on sewing the many poppies onto the backing so that they are ready to be displayed. Any completed poppies should be handed to the group as soon as possible so that they can be included.



However, if you would like to contribute certain poppies to the event you still can, as there are plans to decorate the War Memorial site with stones painted with poppies around the base and to create a cascade of plastic poppies inspired by the ceramic poppies from the Tower of London. Information on how to make both is available on the website, but if you are not creative you can help by donating any empty transparent fizzy drinks bottles to Mark at 16 New Walk, he will have a bag hanging on his side gate to collect any donations – however please make sure the bottles have 4 or 5 dimples at the base as this is critical for the poppy design. Please help - we need over 600!

We are also delighted that we have got a grant from the Armed Forces Covenant Fund for 10 Silhouettes from the **There But Not There** program and these will be on display in All Saints' Church over the Remembrance weekend along with information about the 24 soldiers commemorated on the War Memorial, and of course the knitted poppies.

On Sat. 10 and Sun. 11 November the **Hull & East Yorkshire Villagers at War Exhibition** will be open from 10am to 4pm in the Village Hall. The exhibition includes around 1000 artefacts from the World War One Battle fields and a large collection of Stories of East Yorkshire Soldiers that served in the War. Our thanks go to Mike Mitchell for remodelling the bus stop by the war memorial to commemorate the 100 years since the end of WW1. Please take the time to visit it and see the information that will be on permanent display

Interested in becoming a Parish Councillor?

In May 2019 North Ferriby will go to the polls to elect a new parish council. Would you be interested in standing for election? The parish council is the tier of local government closest to individual communities, it has the greatest potential for identifying, understanding and addressing the needs of the residents it serves.



North Ferriby Parish Council is not party political. The position is voluntary although some expenses will be paid. The primary role of the council is to represent the views of the residents of the parish **and as an elected member of the parish council you would:**

- ▶ Have responsibility for running local services, such as the playing fields
- ▶ Help decide how much money should be raised through council tax to deliver these services
- ▶ Be part of the planning process, and comment on planning applications within the parish.
- ▶ Work towards improving quality of life and the environment
- ▶ Identify issues which are important to the lives of the residents you represent.
- ▶ Work towards bringing about improvements through local projects, lobby other service providers and work in partnership with other parishes and agencies

To stand for election as a parish councillor you must:

- ▶ Be 18 years of age or over
- ▶ Be resident in the parish and on the electoral register (there are some exceptions)
- ▶ Be able to attend regular evening meetings
- ▶ Be interested in local issues and keen to improve the local environment
- ▶ Understand and be willing to represent the views of the whole community
- ▶ Agree to abide by a Code of Conduct and publically declare any interests which may conflict with your duties as parish councillor

Does this sound like you? If so please contact the clerk for more information or come along and observe a meeting of the parish council, which meets in the Village Hall at 7.30pm on the fourth Monday in the month. Dates for meetings of the sub-committees are on the Ferriby website.

Energy from Waste Incinerator - Update

The parish council strongly opposed Solar 21's proposed waste incinerator on land south west of Melton Waste Park (18/00703/CM). With input from ward councillors the council's objections were put directly to members of the ERYC Planning Committee in July. The Planning committee agreed to defer completion of a legal agreement to secure a financial contribution to the community, which the developers had offered. and If agreed within two months of the committee date, the application would be approved. The committee agreed to the council's request that a liaison committee be established so that elected representatives can meet regularly with the company and receive operational data, particularly data around emissions.

The parish council was disappointed with the deferred approval as it was considered that some issues had not been represented properly in the application documents. The council therefore submitted a request to the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government to call the application in and take the ultimate decision. This request was unsuccessful so it is anticipated that the application will be approved in due course.
