## Would you be vulnerable in an emergency?

All personal details are retained securely and are not available to the public. They will however be shared with the relevant emergency services and possibly the Local Authority in the event of an emergency. If the weather is bad for a prolonged period you could receive contact from the Parish Council to ensure that you have support and sufficient provisions/medicines.

Those that have previously registered their details will be included in the updated Plan.

## Ferriby Commemorates Merchant Navy Day

North Ferriby celebrated Merchant Navy Day on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> September, by flying the Red Ensign to commemorate the important role that the Merchant Navy played in both World Wars. Merchant Navy Day also celebrates the part played by modern seafarers in keeping our country provided with vital goods such as food and fuel and enables many firms and businesses to export, enhancing our position as a trading nation.

Parish Council Chairman, Cllr Mrs Belinda Hookem said, 'We are proud of our river heritage in North Ferriby dating back to the Bronze Age and we see merchant ships carrying their cargoes up and down the River Humber on a daily basis. We displayed the Red Ensign on our Riverside Walkway and also at our War Memorial for four days from Friday 1<sup>st</sup> to Monday 4<sup>th</sup> September. We hope that residents took the opportunity to see it. We also hoped that it was seen and appreciated by those cargo vessels using the waterway during that period.'



## Commemoration of the end of World War One

November 11<sup>th</sup> 2018 will see commemorations around the country for the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of WW1. North Ferriby will be joining the commemorations by lighting the beacon as part of a nationwide chain. Other activities will also be taking place on the day and we will give further information in future newsletters. 

## Future Development in North Ferriby

At the time of going to print the outcome of the challenge in the Court of Appeal by St Modwen Properties about Melton Fields was still outstanding. It is believed that the judgement will be announced early in October. The Parish Council will post the outcome on its website as soon as we receive it.

To remind you, the **East Riding Local Plan** allows for a total of 165 dwellings in the village in the period to 2029. The allocations document & map are on the Ferriby website.

<b>FER-A Land at Godfrey Robinson House</b>	<b>20</b>
<b>FER-B - Land off Ferriby High Road</b>	<b>113</b>
<b>FER-C - Land East of Wilson Close</b>	<b>18 (now completed)</b>
<b>FER-D - Land at Grange Lane</b>	<b>9</b>
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>165</b>

By far the largest of these is for **113 Dwellings** off Ferriby High Road to the east of the school (Reference Number **FER-B**)

Residents should be aware that this *will* happen at some stage as the principle for development has been established, but no application has been made yet. In the meantime, the Parish Council is continuing in its efforts, together with Ward Councillors, to secure the type of accommodation that we have evidenced is required in the village to meet the needs of residents. We have already secured the provision of additional recreation land to the south of the development site and adjacent to the existing playing field.

When a planning application is submitted the Parish Council will scrutinise the details and endeavour to get the best outcome for the village, such as commuted sums, provision of amenities as well as suitable housing types. We will ensure that residents are aware of the application so that those that wish can submit their opinions.
