When the Big Lunch was transferred to the Parish Hall this spirit was apparent, because we think around 350 people crammed themselves into the Hall and enjoyed their picnic lunch just as much as if it had been on the school field as originally planned. And what can we say about the Fun Day, other than that it exceeded all our expectations, and the fine weather turned it into a perfect family event?

We also raised a substantial amount for the two village charities, primarily the Village Hall Trust, and also the North Ferriby Riding for the Disabled Group. We don't know the final figures



yet but once all the monies have been collected and the bills paid it will be an impressive total.

As several of the many congratulatory messages we have received have pointed out, this was a Festival which must be the envy of all our neighbours, and indeed of people who came from farther afield. One family from Nantwich in Cheshire were amazed that "such a small village could put on such a large pageant" when their own town had hardly any bunting or flags up.
