News from the Playing Fields

Over the coming months a lot will be happening to improve the playing field. In response to repeated complaints, both from clubs playing on the field and from other village residents, about dog mess left by irresponsible dog walkers, the Trustees have decided **not to allow dogs on the field** so that it can be used for its primary purpose without health risks.

In the play park we are working with parents of children with disabilities to install some inclusive play equipment and to improve their access. Funding will come from the commuted sums paid by the developer of Wilson Close. We hope this fund will also contribute to some necessary improvements planned by Cricket Club and Bowls Club. These could include an artificial pitch to assist the training of junior cricketers or removable covers to protect the wicket against the weather. If you think there are further enhancements that can be made to the playing field please contact the Parish Clerk.

The Playing Fields Committee has commissioned a professional artist (unfortunately not Banksy!) to decorate one of the skate park structures with a design chosen in consultation with young people using the facility – see the photo.

We intend to upgrade the CCTV system to provide coverage of areas not fully covered at present, with high-resolution cameras for better identification capabilities.

Melton Fields - request for signs to be removed

As we reported in our December newsletter, the Parish Council was pleased with the ruling from the Court of Appeal in October to dismiss the appeal by St Modwen Development Ltd in its entirety. The ruling backed up the refusal by East Riding of Yorkshire Council of two proposals for housing development on the site in 2013.

The ruling now brings this long running saga to an end, and the Planning Department at East Riding of Yorkshire Council is now asking residents to remove all 'Save North Ferriby' signs, **which technically require planning consent**, from their gardens and driveways. The Department has already made a request to the Save Our Ferriby group for the signs to be removed and will be contacting individual property owners shortly to ask that any remaining signs be taken down.

Wind Turbine funds for Community Benefit

North Ferriby Residents are to benefit from funds to the tune of £7600 per annum from the owners of the two wind turbines at Melton. The Parish Council will be looking for proposals on how these funds could be used to benefit the community.

Details on how to apply to the fund will be given in its June newsletter, along with any eligibility criteria.





First World War Centenary Poppies

Closure of our Last Post Office

We are sure that all residents will join us in saying a big thank you to **Mike Bonewell** for his years of service as an excellent Postmaster for the village. We are truly sorry that the Post Office is closing and send Mike and his family best wishes for the future. (There are plans for the defibrillator to be re-located at the Village Hall). This has been Ferriby's **Fourth Post Office** and has been at its location for **83 years since 1935**.



From **1846 to 1887** the **First Post Office** was in the High Street somewhere near the site of the present Methodist Church. The building probably does not exist today.

From **1887 to 1923** the **Second Post Office** was located at the corner of Low Street and Turners Lane, and is now a dwelling house.



From **1923 to 1935** the **Third Post Office** was built on the corner of High street and Woodgates Lane, next to the then Telephone Exchange. It was most recently The Beauty Spot hairdressers.
