The Queen's Platinum Jubilee 2nd – 5th June

Seventy years on the throne is an incredible milestone, a feat no previous monarch has achieved, and the Parish Council is ready to celebrate with the village during this special Jubilee long weekend. Before then both the school and Parish Council will be planting new trees as part of the Queen's Green Canopy project, and the Environment Committee will be updating Coronation Gardens to mark the event, using plants with red, white and blue flowers and planting a new tree dedicated to Prince Philip. Saturday 4th June & Sunday 5th June, Riding for the Disabled Jubilee Fundays


Between 10 and 4pm, the RDA site at Riverside Walkway will be contributing to the fun with a bouncy castle, face-painting, a dog show and a 5km fun run. Food and drink will be available from their kiosk all day.

Saturday 4th June Conservation Open Day The Parish Council will be hosting the Conservation Open Day with representatives from Mires Beck Nursery, North Cave. There will be activities for all, young or old at the Riverside Walkway. They will be demonstrating the wealth of wildlife to be seen here and setting up a guided walk around the area. The Parish Council has worked with Mires Beck to develop a Conservation Management Plan for the Walkway and will be sharing their ideas as to how this will be executed over the next few years. Packets of seeds will be given to those who attend.

Sunday 5th June Jubilee Big Lunch It is HM The Queen's wish that people spend the day celebrating with your neighbours and having Street Parties. Involve your neighbours and celebrate in style. We are sure that the village will be full of chatter and good humour. If you want to close your road, East Riding of Yorkshire Council has given guidance on how to arrange a road closure, and this is available on the Parish Council website.

For those of you unable to close the road, or without an organised local party, you will be welcome at the **Riverside Walkway** with your picnics to spend the afternoon on the banks of the Humber.



Environment Committee News

The Environment Committee was successful in getting a grant from the National Lottery 'Together for our Planet' award for work to establish the Conservation Management Plan and encourage greater biodiversity on the Riverside Walkway. Part of this grant will be spent on the Conservation Open Day on Saturday 4th June but the rest used to implement the plan.



Thank you to all those who helped with the clearance work in the Enchanted Woodland before Christmas.

Parish Council Precept Increase

You will notice when you receive your Council Tax from ERYC that the amount requested from the Parish Council is an increase on last year. This equates to less than £1 a month on a Band D property. It is regrettable that we ask this from you at a time that other household bills are increasing but we need to ensure that there are sufficient funds available to the PC to protect the village and to take legal and professional advice when necessary. Should these additional funds not be called upon, the increase will be 'returned' to residents the following year by way of a reduction in the precept.

Mega-Warehouse Melton Plot E Questionnaire

The final planning approval for the 'Amazon' building was issued in February. It is important that residents make their views known to the Parish Council as to what they prefer to see on the open space between the development site and the Long Plantation.

Village Household Questionnaire Open Space Adjacent to Proposed 'Amazon' Site Melton Fields <small>North Ferriby Parish Council</small>
<small>You may be aware that the approval of the proposed site for the 'Amazon' distribution warehouse has been deferred until certain conditions have been completed. It is expected that approval may be granted subject to these conditions being successfully discharged.</small> <small>The strip of Open Space between the development and Long Plantation is owned by East Riding of Yorkshire Council and is currently used by Wykeland Group for storage. This land is currently designated as Open Space and freely accessible to the public, but it has been incorporated within the development site. On the initial plans, this land was shown covered in "bands" whose purpose was to reduce noise from the site.</small> <small>Wykeland Group, Council and our residents, along with Ferriby 2020 campaign group, believe that Open Space being used in this way as the proposed 'bands' reduces the functionality of the space for the community.</small>

Thank you to those that have completed the questionnaire to date, there has been a good response showing how important that space is to residents. Please ensure that any outstanding questionnaires are completed and submitted by 31st March. Wykeland has asked to be informed of the outcome and a meeting will follow once we have analysed your views.

Bus Service Changes

ERYC has agreed to fund the **150 bus** to Hessle after the successful completion of the trial period. It will continue to run on Tuesdays and Thursdays but from **Tuesday**

5th April the route will change to allow the bus to serve the new Health Centre in Anlaby. It will no longer turn around at Gibson Lane, Melton, but turn at The Sandpiper roundabout.



There is no change to the route through North Ferriby but stops after The Sandpiper will be **3 minutes earlier** than at present.

The **55 bus** between Elloughton and Goole ceases operation on Saturday 9th April. Links between Elloughton and Hull will be maintained by a **revised service 55**.

Also on Saturday 9th April the **X5 service** from Goole to Hull will also cease to operate.

Transwaste Community Liaison Group

The Parish Clerk, Jo, is the Parish Council's representative on the Transwaste CLG. This has now met twice with a further meeting due to take place in April.

There was some disagreement at the last meeting as to how impactful the odours of household waste are on the village, with the Environment Agency (EA) reporting only two complaints this year.

It is important that the EA has an accurate picture of the situation and the Parish Council asks residents to ring the EA 24-hour hotline 0800 807060 when odours are experienced.
