The Parish Council was pleased to be able to give each child at North Ferriby School the gift of a package of seed balls to grow in their gardens or in a place of their choice. The idea came from the environmental theme of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and also because the Parish Council resolved late last year that it would give emphasis to increasing the biodiversity of the natural community. Coronation Gardens & Coronation Oak



For the 1953 Coronation a small public garden was created and Coronation Gardens is still a much-loved place. The other lasting memorial was the Coronation Oak on the Playing Fields

The Environment Committee has recently introduced new plants and further additions will be made. A young cherry tree has been planted in memory of Prince Philip, and once this has established a plaque will be installed.

Parking restrictions in North Ferriby

The PC responded to the recent consultation on parking restrictions in various locations in the village, which includes Corby Park, Ings Lane and High Street/Woodgates Lane. We reiterated concerns previously made that the proposal for the eastern side of Corby Park, near the junction with Melton Road, does not extend sufficiently to avoid the potential for conflict between motorists and cyclists. The PC has requested a site meeting with East Riding officers to explain our concerns.



North Ferriby consultation on Open Space



Nearly 300 households responded to the PC's questionnaire about the Open Space to the west of Long Plantation. The responses have been summarised and are available to view on the Parish Council website under News & Events.

These findings were presented to Wykeland and the planning case officer at a meeting in April. Wykeland had already drawn up proposals for the Open Space and is now considering a revised proposal. There were two main areas of disagreement,

the first to have the width of Long Plantation increased with further tree planting whereas Wykeland proposed most of the additional planting against the acoustic fence. The second was about footpaths – residents preferred the ability to roam and create natural paths as happens now, whereas Wykeland proposed 700m of edged crushed stone paths, 2m in width. Wykeland will consult residents and the Parish Council before submitting its final version for approval.



Dog Fouling

Many thanks to the volunteers who picked up the dog dirt left by irresponsible dog owners on the Riverside Walkway before the Jubilee events, over 100 piles were removed. Please make sure you pick up after your dog.
