



Parish Council launches campaign against dog fouling

The parish council recently launched its anti-dog fouling campaign at a successful event that was attended by ERYC Dog Wardens. Parish councillors and wardens handed out dog bags and literature to interested residents in an attempt to raise the awareness of the strength of feelings that surround the failure of owners that fail to pick up after their pets.

Wardens will be patrolling areas of the village in coming months and in particular Riverside Walkway where fouling continues to be a big problem. It is essential that dog owners pick up on the walkway so that families and children can enjoy the open space without fear of contamination and disease.

- It is illegal to leave your dog's faeces lying around in a public area including footpaths
- It is the responsibility of the dog owner or the person in charge to clear up after their dog
- Regulations state that being unaware that your dog has fouled, or not having a suitable means of picking up is not a reasonable excuse for failing to clean up after a dog
- If you do not clear up after your dog you could be fined up to £1000 in a magistrate's court, or a warden can issue a fixed penalty notice for £75

If you see irresponsible dog owners fail to clear up after their dog has fouled call the Animal Warden Service on (01482) **396 301**. Give details of the location and the time and date of the fouling and, where possible name and address of the dog owner and a description of the dog. To request the removal of fouling from streets/footpaths ring (01482) **393 939**.



Melton Park planning application REFUSED

The planning application for 510 homes at Melton Park **was refused** by ERYC's planning committee in mid-May. It was a unanimous decision.

The applicant, St Modwen Properties PLC has six months in which to appeal the decision.

North Ferriby Village Hall Redevelopment Volunteers wanted

North Ferriby Village Hall Redevelopment Group recently held an open day to launch plans for the redevelopment and extension of the Village Hall.



Before embarking on the plans the community of North Ferriby was asked 'What is needed from the village hall?' The village wanted a Community Centre at the heart of North Ferriby. A hall with a stage and excellent light and sound, a great open space for parties and dances, these the hall already provides. What more? A drop-in lounge for young people to use in the evening and older folk during the day, good meeting rooms and a doctors surgery.

The plans that were on show provide these and much more. They incorporate a good sized library and a doctors' surgery with space for a nurse's office, bringing much wanted and needed services to the community all under one roof. Plans also include a kitchen and bar area as well as two good meeting rooms.

'It is an exciting time for the Village', said Brian Bannister, Chair of the Redevelopment Group 'As we approach its centenary year, it is important that we produce a hall that will be at the heart of the community for another 100 years. The open day has provided a great opportunity to discuss ideas with residents of North Ferriby and also to launch the Centenary Redevelopment Fund. The building work will not be cheap and we need to work together as a community to raise the necessary funds. We are looking for volunteers to help with fund raising ideas and events, people with experience of grant applications, in fact anybody who can spare some time to help in any way they can.'

Long Plantation

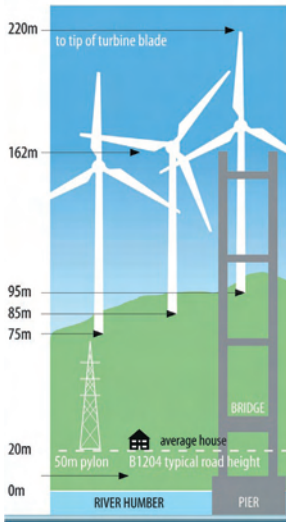
Work has recently been undertaken in Long Plantation to remove around 60 diseased sycamore trees. Replanting with suitable native species will take place in the Autumn.

The work has been done by St Modwen Properties PLC under the guidance of East Riding of Yorkshire Council. It has no connection with any possible development on Melton Fields.



Proposed Wind Farm Saxby Wold

We were made aware of an application for a proposed wind farm to be erected at Saxby Wold, North Lincolnshire. Saxby Wold lies approximately four miles due south of North Ferriby. There was strong local opposition to the application, which was rejected twice by the local planning authority. The application went to appeal and was heard by the Planning Inspector in May.



We were advised that if the wind farm went ahead then there would be a crest of ten large wind turbines along the top of Saxby Wold, which lies directly opposite North Ferriby across the River Humber. We have been told that, taking into account the elevation of the land above sea level and the **proposed height of the wind turbines (124m), the total elevation will exceed the height of the Humber Bridge**, as the graphic clearly shows.

The chairman of North Ferriby Parish Council therefore attended the planning hearing to give evidence to the planning inspector as to the effect that this proposal may have on residents and to request that he takes note of the cumulative impact of the wind farms that have been built or have permission in the East Riding and surrounding authorities. 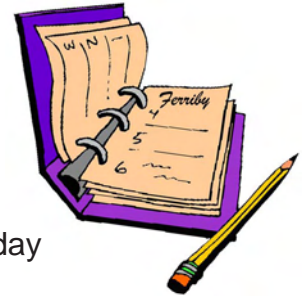
