
## HM The Queen's birthday beacon

Neil Moor was the Beacon Master for the evening and our thanks go to him and everyone else involved in this special occasion.

## Melton Fields Update

Following the rejection of St Modwen's challenge to the High Court on the Secretary of State's appeal decision on every count, the company is now seeking leave for the matter to be heard in the Court of Appeal. We will update the Parish Council website when more information is available.

Protest signs, provided by the residents' action group against the original two planning applications and the subsequent appeals, have been erected in the village since 2012. During that time the Parish Council has received approaches from many residents that have not been happy with the impact on the street scene, particularly those residents that have been trying to sell their property. For the sake of those residents that have tolerated the protest signs during the last four years of planning activity, can the Parish Council respectfully suggest that the signs are now taken down?

Thank you for your understanding and be assured that the Parish Council remains committed to opposing any proposal for housing on Melton Fields and will take any relevant action that may be required.

### For whom the bell tolls

The Bell Ringers from All Saints' into a joint project with the Royal British Legion to remember the 26 service men from the village that died in the First World War and are commemorated on the Village War Memorial.

At 6pm on the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of each death the Church tenor bell is tolled 100 times as an act of remembrance. Tolling is the slow ringing of a single bell. This type of ringing is most often associated with death, the slow pace broadcasting a feeling of sadness as opposed to the jubilance and joy of quicker ringing. A short insert with details of the soldier's name, age, regiment and place of burial appears in the Parish Magazine each month a serviceman is commemorated. Next time you hear the bell tolling, perhaps take a little time to remember a young man from the village that went to war and never returned.
