A number of parish councillors stood down at the end of their term of office in May.

A huge thank you to Margaret Hyland who was a member of the council since the 1970s. Margaret made a big contribution to the environment of the village and in particular Riverside Walkway. She was one of a number of former councillors who turned the Walkway from being a closed refuse tip into the place of leisure and recreation that forms part of the Yorkshire Wolds Way and which is enjoyed by many walkers and dog walkers today.

Also standing down was Chris Swindin who had been on the council since 2004. Chris has been very proactive as the chairman of both the Planning Committee and the Playing Field Committee. He was previously Chairman of the Village Hall and was instrumental in making space available to enable the GP surgery to relocate there. He has provided wisdom and guidance on all of his committees and has been a great support to successive Chairmen of the Council.



Also standing down were Michael Payne (joined in 2011) and was a valued member of the Playing Field Committee for a number of years, Chris Taylor (joined in 2015) who contributed greatly to the Planning Committee and helped the PC to get to grips with online planning applications, and Erika Burney (joined in 2016) who enjoyed being part of the Environment Committee and was instrumental in the refurbishment of the bus shelter near The Duke of Cumberland as part of Freshen Up Ferriby Day. 

Criminal activity in Ferriby and surrounding areas

Humberside Police have informed us of a number of incidents that have taken place in Ferriby and Swanland. They want residents to be informed about several **shed and garage burglaries** that have taken place.

The Police advice is to be aware of who is about, as it seems that out buildings are often staked out before the actual burglary takes place, so ensure they are adequately padlocked and alarmed and externally lit if possible. Check them regularly so that you know quickly if they have been broken into. There have also been several high-value vehicles stolen – don't keep keys near a door or on view. It is suggested that keyless ignition fobs can be kept in a microwave oven as the casing prevents the key receiving a transmission from signal boosters, which are used by some car thieves (but do not forget they are in the microwave before switching it on!)

Update on waste-related Planning Applications

Two outstanding planning applications for an anaerobic digester (AD) and for 24 hour working at Transwaste, Gibson Lane, Melton were heard together by the ERYC Planning Committee in April.

The AD plant was approved but the application for 24 hour working was refused following representation from ward and parish councillor Julie Abraham.

The applicant has six months in which to appeal the decision to refuse. If an appeal is lodged we shall inform residents on our website.
