## Reed Pond Update

Work on the pond restoration has progressed satisfactorily and the excavation has been completed. The spoil currently deposited adjacent to the western bank of the pond is to be removed and placed around the south eastern bank of the pond and levelled.

Due to the wet weather the removal of the spoil from Ings Field will take place in the early Spring to avoid causing damage to the surface of Ings Field by contractor's vehicles. At the same time any outstanding work around the pond, such as cleaning the area around the sluice, will be undertaken prior to final levelling, seeding and planting of the affected areas.

Thanks to Brian Bannister, Pat Lambert and John Mabbett for the huge amount of effort that has gone into this project.




## North Ferriby Calendars 2016

## PLANNING NEWS

### Melton Fields

#### Proceedings go into 2016

The Secretary of State has dismissed both appeals relating to the proposed development of 510 or 390 dwellings at Melton Fields. St Modwen has lodged an appeal to the High Court. It is believed that they can only challenge the investigative procedure NOT the decision itself.

The next stage is for a judge to consider whether or not there are grounds to grant permission to challenge the decision. The hearing (in the Administrative Court at Leeds) has been listed for one and a half days on the 28th and 29th January 2016, when it will consider the validity of the Secretary of State's decision which St Modwen is seeking to quash.

#### Local Plan still under consideration

We are still awaiting the approval of the East Riding Local Plan and an indication of whether additional homes will be allocated on land off Ferriby High Road to the east of the school. It is hoped that the Plan will be signed off by the Spring. The Parish Council has made representations to the planning inspector that, if he is minded to agree the higher number of homes on the land off Ferriby High Road, he takes account of the Housing Needs Survey and considers that more housing for older people should be provided there on.

#### Carols round the Lychgate

The Parish Council is holding its 'Carols round the Lychgate' event on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> December at 7 pm. with Beverley Brass Band in attendance. Mince pies and punch will be available after the service - if wet singing will take place in the Church. All welcome. Please bring a lantern or a torch.
