Housing Land Bids

the future of housing in North Ferriby

The East Riding of Yorkshire Council has consulted the Parish Council on the sites that have been submitted by landowners for allocation for new housing development as the authority progresses its new Local Planning policies. This is in preparation for the publication of a "Core Strategy" and a separate Land Allocations Plan in early 2013. The Core Strategy will define overall land needs and general locations for development, and the Land Allocations document will detail exactly where the ERYC will expect development to take place, or not to take place.

A "fact checking" exercise has been carried out on the information held about each of the sites that have been put forward. This information will assist in the selection of sites to be allocated for development in the new Local Plan. ***It is emphasised that there will be a need to allocate only a small proportion of the sites that have been put forward for development.***

In North Ferriby Parish 10 sites have been put forward, of which 2 are considered too small to include in this exercise. Details of the consultation, and of the Parish Council's comprehensive and detailed response, are available on line.

Upgrade - Humberfield Waste Site

A three-month project to upgrade the facilities at the Humberfield household waste recycling site commenced on Monday 19th November. Part of the site will remain open for use by the public during that period but residents with large vans that require a permit and all cars with trailers should use alternative sites at Weel or Preston.

Environmental Ceramic Sculpture Firing

Sculptor Erica Wilson has built a kiln near the Ferriby Riverbank with a ceramic installation shaped like large bolder stones as two pillars. After firing the kiln it will now be mounded up with earth and plants encouraged to grow over to make it part of its location.

The ceramic top has holes in it which glowed spectacularly during the firing and will allow for wildlife to climb inside and the work then becomes a habitat for wildlife.

The top of the work is made of hard wood, which will change and alter with the seasons. It is an environmental work which over time will hopefully become one with the nature reserve where it sits. See the spectacular firing on YouTube by following the link on the Ferriby website News page.
