Co-Op Helps To Light Up The Village This Christmas

Parish Councillors and school children from North Ferriby will join together to celebrate the start of the festive period at an exciting time for the village as the new Co-op store opens in the run up to Christmas. Children have been invited by the parish council to switch on the 1200 white lights on the 22 feet tall Christmas tree next to the village War Memorial, the lights having been sponsored by The Co-operative as it opens the new store on High Street.

Parish Council Chairman John Mabbett said, "We have invested quite a lot of time and funding in the last two years to provide a Christmas Tree in a prominent position for the whole village to be proud of. We had some really positive comments about the new position for the tree last year so this year we wanted to share the magic of Christmas with the children from our village school as many of them will see the tree as they go to and from school each day. The Co-op has kindly donated £600 to cover the cost of Christmas tree lights to celebrate the new store opening in the village and they will also provide refreshments for the occasion"

The funding marks The Co-operative's strong partnership with the local community. Helen Palmer, Manager of The Co-operative's North Ferriby Food store, said: "We are proud to be playing a key part in North Ferriby's Christmas celebrations this year. The centre always looks fantastic over the Christmas period, and we are thrilled to help it to be even better in 2013". As well as taking part in the switching on of the lights, children from the school will sing carols around the tree.

Melton Park Planning Appeal deferred until April 2014

The planning appeal for 510 houses in Melton, scheduled to commence on 19th November, was, after two days of preliminary legal deliberations, deferred until 29th April 2014. It was decided by the planning inspector that a venue in North Ferriby could be considered for the hearing and East Riding of Yorkshire Council will now look into the suitability of available accommodation and advise the inspectorate accordingly. The parish council will continue to inform residents via its website and give an update in its Spring newsletter.

In the meantime the second planning application, which is for 390 new homes, remains on the table and will be determined by East Riding Council in due course.

Village Hall Toilets Upgrade at last!

Next year will see the start of work on a complete renewal of the toilets at the front of the Village Hall. We have been uncomfortably aware for some time of their poor condition and their need for constant repairs, and that they do not meet current standards, but the Hall's financial position has been such that it has been impossible to do anything more than emergency repairs.

The Biffa Award has promised us a grant of over £40,000 to bring the toilets up to date. This is a multimillion pound fund, which awards grants from landfill tax credits provided by Biffa Group Limited to community and environmental projects across the UK. To meet the grant conditions the Parish Council is also contributing 10% of the project cost.

Total Build Solutions has been selected to do the work, which will start on 6th January next and be complete by the end of February. The bar area will become the new ladies' toilets, and the current ladies' and gents' toilets will become the new gents' toilet, with a dedicated disabled toilet also opening off the lobby. Bar facilities will be provided from the kitchen, Priory Room or Committee Room, depending on the function. While the work is under way the rest of the Hall will be in use as normal, but access to the premises will be through the rear door.

This will be a major improvement in time for the Hall's Centenary celebrations, which start with a superb Dinner Dance on Saturday 22nd March.
