Post Office relocation proposals – have your say



As reported on the Parish Council website, consultation is taking place on proposals to relocate the Post Office from its current home to May News, 40 Church Road, in February/March 2018. The Post Office would like to hear your views before finalising its proposals.

But please be quick as consultation ends on **Thursday 7th December** and responses received after that date will not be accepted. Melton Fields Outcome

The latest attempt by St Modwen Properties to gain planning permission for housing on Melton Fields **was dismissed in October by the Court of Appeal** in London. A copy of the full judgement can be found on the Parish Council website. St Modwen Properties subsequently sought leave to appeal to the Supreme Court but that application was also dismissed by the Court of Appeal.



It has been confirmed by the developers that they do not intend to progress the two planning applications that have been the subject of this protracted process any further.

Thank You to all those residents that have been involved in successfully opposing these applications.

WW1 events planned for November 2018

As stated in the last newsletter, the village will be commemorating the end of WW1 one hundred years ago. On **11th November 2018** we shall be joining in the chain of beacon lighting up and down the country and the bell ringers will be ringing the bells along with other churches and cathedrals nationwide.

There are plans to expand the **Villagers at War exhibition** to include more re-enactment groups and we are working on creating two displays of poppies, one on Riverside Walkway and one at a location to be decided.


The girls produced a guide that sold for £1.00 each and also held other activities that together raised £500 for The Sick Children's Trust.

Emergency Plan



We are revising our **Emergency Plan** and would like to hear from you if you have any particular skills and/or equipment that you would be prepared to offer to complement the emergency services in the case of an event, most likely to be bad weather, flooding or power outages.

Skills required: Medical/First Aid/Carers; Catering; HGV and LGV Licence holders.

Equipment required: ladders; campbeds and supplies of spare bedding; non-mains cooking facilities; 4x4 vehicles; trailers; chainsaws; generators, electric heaters and any other equipment that you possess that may be of use.

If you can help, please forward your details, including mobile phone number and address and information on what you could offer, to the Parish Clerk or call **631 822**. Your details will be kept secure and only extracted in the event of an incident.

If you or someone that you know should be vulnerable in the event of an emergency you may ask the Clerk at **any time** to add your details to the list of those that may need some assistance depending on the circumstances of the event.
