## Ferriby Remembered



Ferriby marked **100 years since the end of WW1** in November 2018 with thousands of poppies on displays all around the village.

On the Sunday morning a piper played the Scottish lament – Battle's O'er. After a Remembrance Ceremony at the war memorial, the parade went on to the Church. In the evening after lighting the beacon the Church bells rang out.

Over the weekend the Villagers at War exhibition was held in the Village Hall with information about the **24 men from North Ferriby** who lost their lives and are commemorated on the war memorial. Actors in period uniforms gave displays.

## Wind Farm Funds



Ferriby Village Hall Trust is delighted to have been awarded a grant of £5,000 from the Wind Farm Community Fund to be used, together with money already raised from various events, towards the refurbishment of the Priory Rooms which are on the west side of the hall between the kitchen and the doctor's surgery. Building contractors have been hired and the work should be completed by the end of January 2019.

This will increase the size of the Hall with two new toilet cubicles, one for use by disabled visitors and the other unisex, they will have running hot water and electric hand dryers. All doors and windows will be replaced, new lighting installed, extra radiators added, and the ceiling lowered. This will provide a modern multipurpose hall giving enhanced comfort and convenience to our existing users, allow us to organise more exhibitions, entertainments and functions and hopefully attract other interested parties to use the Hall and its facilities and increase our income to allow us to continue our refurbishment programme. ## East Riding Local Plan Review – have your say

East Riding of Yorkshire Council is consulting on the Local Plan Review and Site Assessment from Friday, 9 November and is seeking comments from residents and local communities. Responses to the consultation should be received by Friday, 21 December. This is the first stage in reviewing the local plan adopted in 2016. Responses to the consultation, alongside updated evidence work and sustainability appraisal, will help shape a revised local plan. The council is also undertaking a 'call for sites' during the consultation, which is an opportunity to submit land to the council for consideration.

## Waste-related Planning Applications

Thank you to residents who sent in their comments to the planning applications for Gibson Lane, Melton. The Parish Council Planning Committee unanimously agreed to recommend **refusal** for all of the applications on the grounds on noise, odour, emissions and traffic movement. Together with Ward Councillors, we have requested that ERYC decides all the applications together so that the cumulative impact can be considered. We have also secured a meeting with the Environment Agency in late November, after this newsletter goes to print.

You can raise concerns about noise and odour from any existing activity.

**Riverbank Footpath Closed until March 2019**



The footpath between Ferriby and Hessle will close on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2018 and will reopen on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> March 2019. Additional rock armour will be installed to stabilise the ground movement detected earlier this year, when a crack was found near the railway embankment and Network Rail engineers closed the footpath to install monitoring equipment. To reduce trespassing while the work is being undertaken, Network Rail will be installing anti-trespass fencing and people are urged to keep off the closed path.

**Parking Concerns – Corby Park**

Residents continue to express their concerns over parking in Corby Park near to the junction with Melton Road. This is on a blind bend, which makes it difficult to see cars coming in either direction. Road users would be grateful if vehicles could be parked a little further away from the junction.

**Playing Field Committee News**



The Playing Field Committee has been working hard on a project to introduce some new play equipment into the park. This will give a new access point into the play area suitable for wheelchairs, a new roundabout, new swing seats and a new bench. The CCTV system will be upgraded and new cameras installed near the Skate Park. We are just waiting for the funding to be provided by the commuted sums from the Wilson Close development and hope that the project will be installed in the New Year. The cricket club and bowls club have also applied to the same fund to get equipment and make improvements to their facilities.
