A North Ferriby resident has highlighted an opportunity for volunteering at **Ready Steady Read** which is a local charity working across Hull primary schools to help to improve children's literacy, boost reading ages and develop a lifelong love of reading. It supports children in schools across our region – providing reading helpers, reading spaces, books and dedicated one-on-one support for children who are falling behind with their reading.

The charity recruits and trains volunteers, before placing them in schools to provide one-to-one support. The charity is steadily expanding its volunteer numbers. It has already delivered its reading programme to a huge number of children in the city and has supported over 500 children in the last three terms.

## Street Cleaning and Flooding

In spite of the recent very bad weather there have been no reports to the Parish Council of flooding to properties. The street cleaning that ERYC has done including work on gullies seems to have been successful. We have reported problems with gullies on New Walk and Parkfield Avenue but they are blocked due to tree roots and funding is being sought by Highways to enable repair work to be done. Gullies that are blocked with silt and streets that need to be swept can be reported on the ERYC website or the Clerk will report it for you if you let her know.

## School Parking

The Parish Council has been asked to respectfully ask parents and carers not to park on the double yellow lines at the crossroads by the school. Visibility is significantly compromised by such illegal parking and we would not want to see an accident because of it. The matter has been reported to parking enforcement at ERYC so please observe the parking restrictions.

## Wind Farm Fund

The Parish Council is pleased to report that the second payment from Melton Wind Farm was eventually received at the end of August. Unfortunately, as this was after the closing date for the second year of grant applications the Parish Council had already reduced the maximum grant being offered this year. In the end, the decision was taken to approve all the applications made and the list of grants given is below.

- North Ferriby Village Hall - £1000** – towards the costs of render repairs at the front of the building.
  - North Ferriby CE Primary School - £1000** – towards the creation of an outdoor classroom
  - North Ferriby Twinning Association - £550** – towards the cost of hosting a tea party on 21<sup>st</sup> May 2020 to welcome the visitors from Le Pellerin which will be open to all residents free of charge.
  - Rotary Club of Humberside - £100** – to host the Senior Citizen's Tea Party in the Parish Hall.

## Transwaste Appeal for 24 hour working Dismissed

The Parish Council was pleased to receive the decision of the planning inspector, dismissing the appeal by Transwaste for 24 hour working at its plant in Gibson Lane, Melton. The inspector commented *"Without a detailed design in place to show how types and level of noise would be reduced to an acceptable level, I am not sufficiently comfortable to permit the operation of the site through the night. In essence, it would be a more appropriate approach to consider in detail the type and design of such a system and how it would work to then be content that it would satisfactorily alleviate potential effects before permitting an operation that gives rise to them."*

He concluded, *"The existing condition is reasonable and necessary in the interests of the living conditions of nearby residents with particular regard to noise disturbance. The appeal is therefore dismissed."*

## Any Future Development of Melton Fields

The disturbance from various commercial activities in the southern part of Melton over the summer months has focused everyone's thoughts on the potential loss of amenity that might arise as Melton Fields is developed. To that extent, working with ward councillors, there have been meetings with both ERYC planners and the current land owners. It was suggested that the Parish Council might want to put forward amendments to the adopted East Riding Local Plan which is currently undergoing a refresh. The Parish Council has done that and included suggestions for restrictions on noise in line with World Health Organisation guidelines. We have also requested an appropriate separation distance between the development and Long Plantation and to have a noise reducing bund constructed.

Our comments have been acknowledged but we intend to follow up this with further meetings. Whatever the outcome of our endeavours the revised Local Plan will go to public consultation in 2020 and we will make sure that our residents are informed so that you too can have your say.
