VILLAGE NEWS Autumn 2023



Housing Allocation Fer-B, Ferriby High Road

New plans have been submitted on planning application 21/03132/STPLF. The Parish Council therefore invited Beal Homes to attend its August meeting of the Planning Committee to summarise the major changes. Many of the changes are due to the presence of curlews in the field and are still subject to ongoing debate with Natural England following extensive surveys of wintering birds. 25 acres of mitigation land are proposed by the developer.


The number of dwellings has been reduced from 119 to 115, but there has been an increase in larger

family homes. The proposals will allow for the design of the dwellings to have a rural feel, rather being of a standard design.

The play area which had been proposed separate to the existing play park on the playing field has now been removed and the developer has agreed that assistance should be provided to enhance the existing play area and extend the car park.

Once approval has been received, Beal Homes envisages building 45-50 homes a year after a six-month lead-in period. The main spine road will eventually be adopted by East Riding of Yorkshire Council but the cul-de-sacs off will remain privately owned by the residents living therein.

Whilst the Parish Council welcomes some of the changes made in the new proposals, it has objected on several key issues, most notably what it considers to be an inappropriate housing mix, and the lack of market value bungalows which it wishes to see located to the north of the site for ease of access to local facilities. The PC is also insisting that there be an alternative pedestrian access/exit to the site to better integrate the development into the rest



of the village. Discussion is ongoing about use of the proposed playing field extension for this. The PC has also requested that the existing 30mph speed limit be extended coming out of the village to cover the vehicular access/exit to the development.

- OTHER PLANNING NEWS IN BRIEF -

Soil Bunds on Public Open Space, Long Plantation

North Ferriby PC continues to challenge East Riding Council on the presence of the soil bunds on the Public Open Space to the west of Long Plantation. The PC has taken legal advice on the continuing procrastination of ERYC to ensure the removal of the bunds, which have now been in situ for three years.

— Revised East Riding Local Plan —

The refreshed Local Plan reaches the Examination in Public stage in the Autumn. Although ERYC has taken on board the Parish Council's opinion regarding the open space areas to the east and west of the village (Fer-B site and the formal recognition of the legally defined open space between Long Plantation and Melt-E), the PC has registered to address the Government appointed Planning Inspector to ensure a full understanding of our representations to date. The PC will also be raising its concerns about air quality on which the proposed plan is largely silent.

In addition to its work on the Local Plan, the Parish Council has requested that Long Plantation and the Public Open Space be transferred into the Parish of North Ferriby rather than being in Welton Parish as it is at present. This has been the subject of public consultation and we await the outcome.

Having gained planning permission, the base is scheduled to be laid w/c 11th September and the building itself the following week. This will at last give us a proper workshop to complete our many tasks.

Despite having no facilities, we have managed amongst other things to carry out several repairs to the Ferriby Bowls Club building, the Badminton Clubs storage in Ferriby Village Hall, made Christmas figures, various planters, numerous bird boxes, a hedgehog house and collection boxes for the new Ferriby School houses.

We have refurbished notice boards and two bus stops in Ferriby and Swanland, some benches on the Riverside Walkway and have helped trim the hedges by Ferriby FC ground. Finally, we have taken on an overgrown allotment and are now harvesting our first crops.

We have been overwhelmed by the generosity of both individuals and businesses in the area in donating tools and materials.

It's not all running around with hammers and drills in Ferriby Shed - in fact the name reflects that we have many lady members who produce some amazing goods. We also have members who like to come along to sit and chat over a coffee in convivial company.




North Ferriby Welcomes Ruthvika Spices and Kitchen
