### **CHANGES AT THE PLAYING FIELD**

You might have noticed a new footpath being created by the zip wire at the playing field. This is being done to link residents of the new housing to the village centre and to create access onto the 2 new football pitches beyond the trees, which we hope will come into use this time next year. This land, which has been created by Beal Homes as part of the housing development, will be incorporated into the Playing Field Trust and protected as recreational space for the village in perpetuity.


Additionally, a Pickleball court has been established on one of the tennis courts. All the courts are free to use – just turn up with the appropriate rackets and balls and have fun.






## **FORTY YEARS OF RIVERSIDE WALKWAY**

December 2026 will see the 40th anniversary of the acquisition of North Ferriby's Riverside Walkway. It is the most fantastic asset for our village, but how many people knew it used to be a landfill site? Thanks to the forward thinking of several community people, it was acquired and developed into the 22-acre site we see today. The Parish Council would like to commemorate the anniversary and wants to hear from anyone with memories of the time it was acquired, and to see any photographs you might hold. The intention will be to catalogue the acquisition and subsequent development as a historic resource for the village.

# **WALKING & CYCLING ROUTE** TO SOUTH HUNSLEY SCHOOL

Information relating to the safe route to South Hunsley School has been produced which may be helpful for parents and students alike. If there are concerns about





the use of the underpass, we remind parents that the Parish Council contributes annually to the maintenance of CCTV cameras which look both ways along the footpath on the south side, and on the footpath to the north of the underpass. The cameras are not monitored but images are stored and can be retrieved should an incident occur.



#### - TELL US ABOUT OUR TREES-


The Parish Council regularly inspects trees on the Riverside Walkway and the Playing Field, but if you see any branches that need cutting back because they are an obstruction, please let the Clerk know. Similarly, if you feel any tree may be a safety concern let her know. Trees around the streets are the responsibility of ERYC and any issues can be reported via the ERYC website.
