PARISH COUNCIL TAKES ACTION OVER DUMPED WASTE SOIL ON THE OPEN SPACE ADJACENT **TO LONG PLANTATION**

Over the past 3 years North Ferriby Parish Council has been working hard to persuade East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) officers and the developer Wykeland to remove the waste soil that was deposited on the defined public open space adjacent to Long Plantation. Therefore it was extremely disappointing to see that plans proposed by Wykeland for the open space have now been approved by ERYC officers which requires a total estimated 20,000 tonnes of waste spoil being deposited on the land, well in excess of what is already there now.

The open space land, although owned by ERYC, is leased to Wykeland via legal agreements which establish the land as freely accessible open space with restrictions to retain its creation as a buffer between the village and any development sites beyond. The recently approved plans will change what was a strip of open grassland meadow into a single, limited visibility walkway between bunds and shrubbery with the obvious potential for anti-social and threatening behaviour.

The Parish Council surveyed its residents in 2022 and 80% responding did not wish to see bunds on the land because of safety concerns, which is compatible with ERYC's planning policies and its duty under the Crime and Disorder Act 1998. Indeed, safety concerns around the inclusion of bunds in the plans were also originally highlighted by Humberside Police in late 2022.



The Parish Council has therefore, with regret, resolved to legally challenge ERYC's decision to approve these plans, by way of seeking a Judicial Review with a view to overturning the approval and preventing any bunds being placed on this land, the anticipated cost of which has already been budgeted for.

The last bus returning through the village is at around 2.25pm, terminating at Swanland Pond at 2.30pm
