- NORTH FERRIBY EMERGENCY PLAN -

The Parish Council implemented its Emergency Plan in April when the Environment Agency issued flood warnings along the north Humber Bank and naming several roads in the village specifically. All those residents in the areas of concern on our contact list received a call from the PC to check they were aware and to offer advice if required. Thankfully the very high tides passed without incident.

Flooding is just one type of emergency and the recent lack of fresh drinking water in Devon is another example of one that could impact the



village with little warning. If you consider you might need help in any sort of emergency, please let the PC have your details so that you are on our contact list. We would rather ring you and find you do not need assistance than not ring and have you worried or distressed. The Clerk's details can be found at the bottom of this page.



CONSULTATION ON NEW MELTON INTERCHANGE - HAVE YOUR SAY -

East Riding Council has launched a preliminary consultation about the provision of a transport interchange at Melton, immediately to the south of the Amazon warehouse currently under construction. ERYC, working with partners including Network Rail, National Highways, and Wykeland Group, have developed plans for a new transport interchange at Melton, situated between Brough and Ferriby stations. This consultation will seek to establish if the principle of a new transport interchange is supported at this location. The views of the local and regional population and businesses and the existing users of Brough and Ferriby Station need to be gathered and understood as this will feed into further timetable analysis and business case


- TREE REMOVAL RIVERSIDE WALKWAY -

The Parish Council will be taking action to remove all the sycamore trees in the copse next to the boat pavement on the Walkway.


It is essential to reduce the risk to ponies and horses of ingesting the seedlings in the adjacent paddock.

Trees can only be planted where verges are of a reasonable depth and not close to a road junction or street lights and telegraph poles and they cannot be planted underneath existing telephone lines.
