## North Ferriby Cricket Club 2022 Season



We have had much success at the Cricket club and would like to share this with the community. Our **Junior section** is thriving, with 4 teams over 3 age groups playing in local leagues (from a single team in 2018). We also offer participation at under 9s soft ball cricket tournaments, and the **England Cricket Board Allstars Cricket programme** for 5 to 8 year olds.

We make a special mention to our **Under 15s** who won both their League (by a single point!), and the local Cup competition, the first time in the club's history any junior team has achieved the double. This builds on the success of our **Under 13s** winning their Cup competition in 2021. Our **Senior team** also enjoyed a good season including nurturing the upcoming junior talent.

We are very proud that Dave Wyndham, one of our junior coaches was awarded the Grass Roots Outstanding Contribution Services to Coaching award from Yorkshire County Cricket club.

The club hosted 2 East Yorkshire Representative matches this summer, under 13s and under 11s, and we had many positive comments about the lovely venue and facilities. This is a credit to the village overall, as well as the cricket club groundsmen preparing good quality wickets.

We acknowledge the Parish councils support in maintaining the outfield and Cricket Pavilion, also welcome the Ferriby Shed organisation to use the social space within the Pavilion, we wish them well. ## Update on Fer-B Housing Development

It is twelve months since we informed you about the planning application for 119 new homes to the east of the primary school, accessed from Ferriby High Road. A representative of Beal Homes attended a recent parish council meeting to give us an update as it had all gone very quiet.



Because the site is close to the Humber estuary, Natural England has required that bird surveys be undertaken, and these have revealed the presence of the Curlew which, we know from the west side of the village, is a protected species. Beal Homes is therefore in negotiation with Natural England and planning officers as to how to mitigate for the Curlew. Beal Homes hopes that an acceptable solution can be found to allow the planning application to go to planning committee in the Spring.

## Interested in becoming a Parish Councillor?

In May 2023 North Ferriby will go to the polls to elect a new Parish Council. Would you be interested in standing for election?

The parish council is the tier of local government closest to individual communities, and therefore it has the greatest potential for identifying, understanding, and addressing the needs of the residents it serves. North Ferriby Parish Council is not party political and is made up of 11 councillors.



**To stand for election as a parish councillor you must:**

- Be** a British, Commonwealth or EU citizen
- Be** 18 years of age or over
- Be** resident within the parish or up to 3 miles away, or work in the parish
- Be** able to attend regular evening meetings
- Be** interested in local issues and keen to improve the local environment
- Understand** and be willing to represent the views of the whole community
- Agree** to abide by a Code of Conduct and publicly declare any interests which may conflict with your duties as parish councillor

Eligible candidates for election must be nominated by two electors in the parish.
