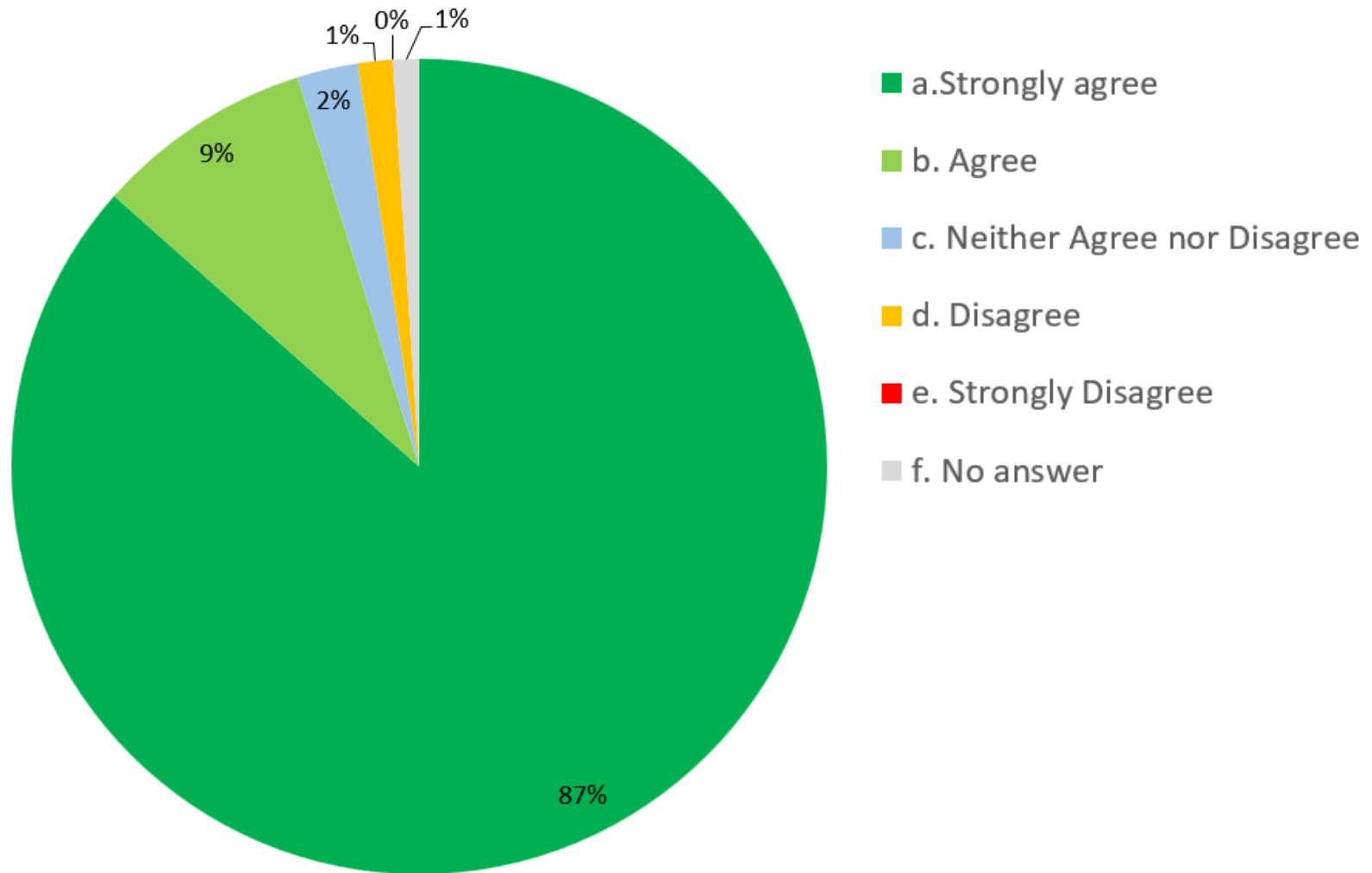


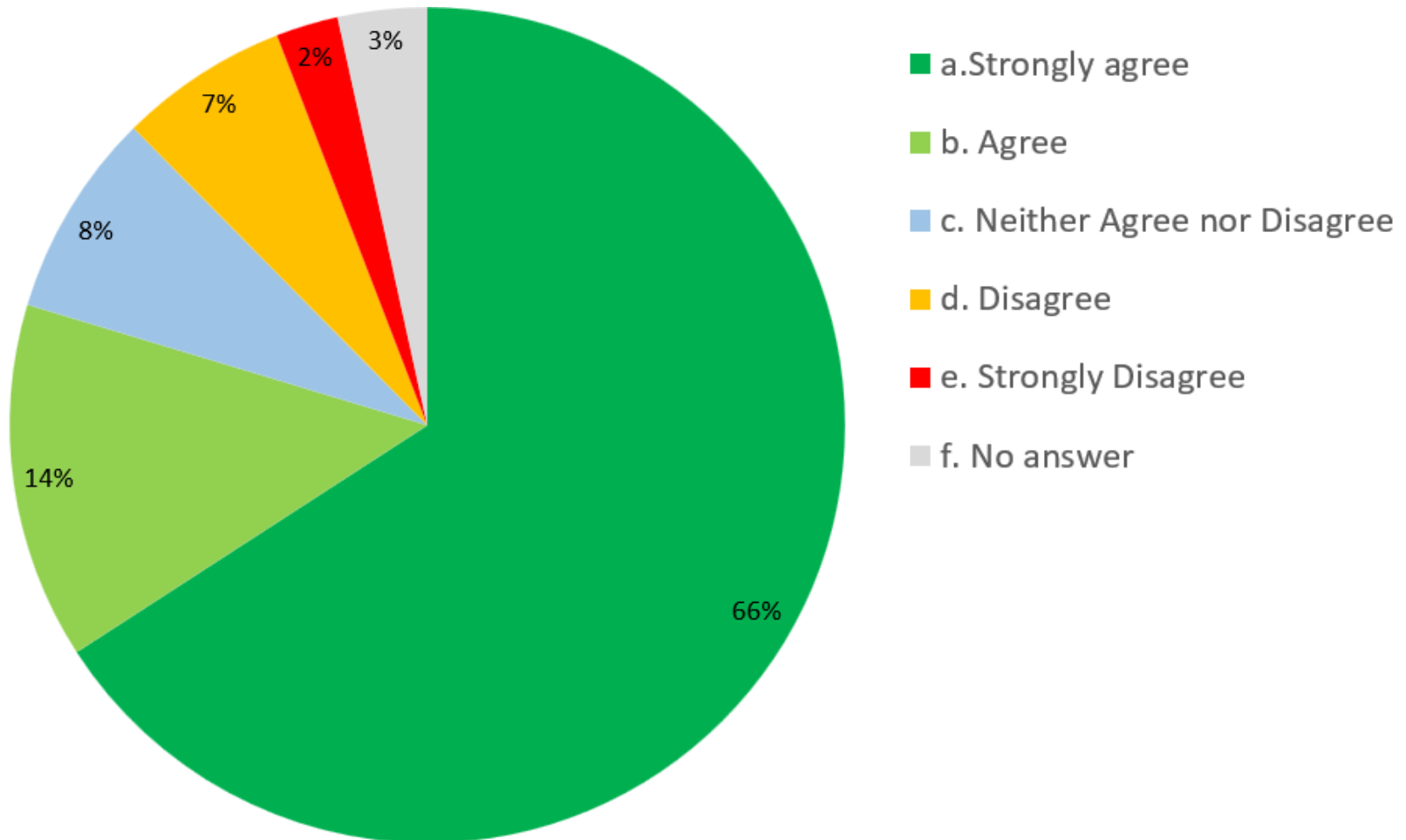
# NFPC Questionnaire

- Nearly 300 questionnaires completed
- 75% of streets covered in responses
- 58% of responses gave further suggestions
- Responses
  - 81% say bunds against Long Plantation should be removed (Q6)
  - 80% say there should be no bunds on the land (Q2)
  - 97% say the acoustic fence should be screened by planting (Q8)

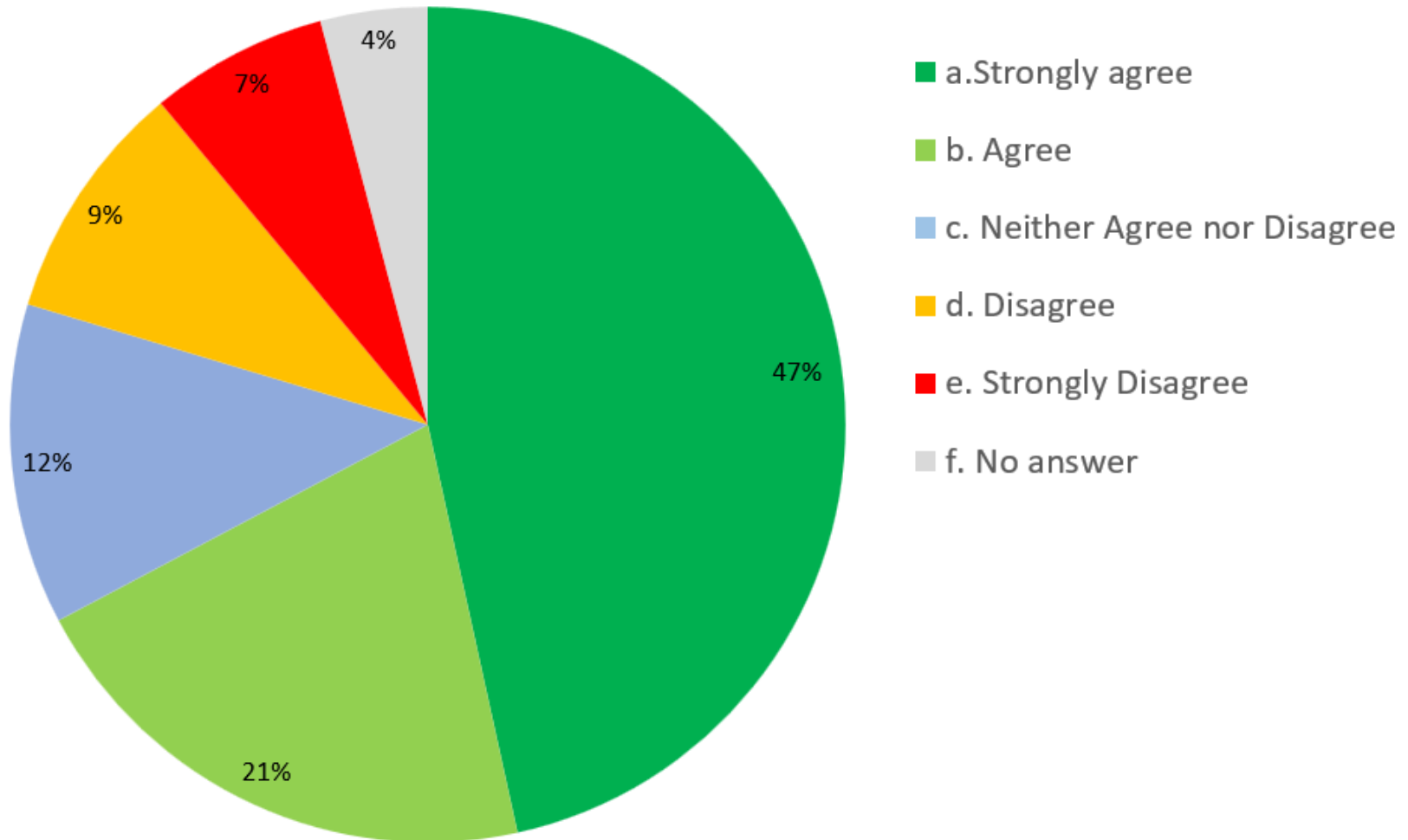
Q1 - Members of this household would like to be able to continue to use this open space.



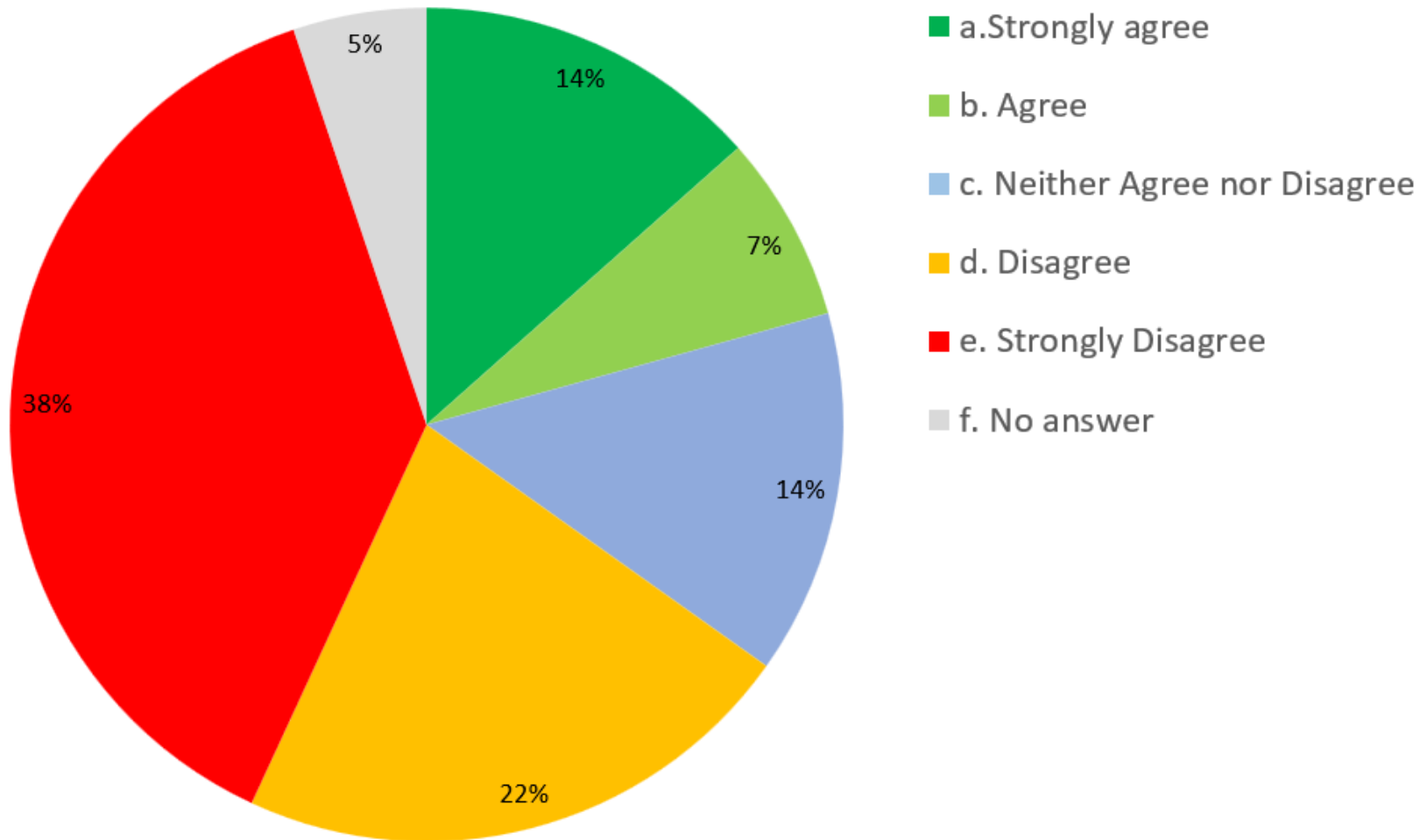
Q2 - The Open Space should remain designated for free public access with no bunds on the land.



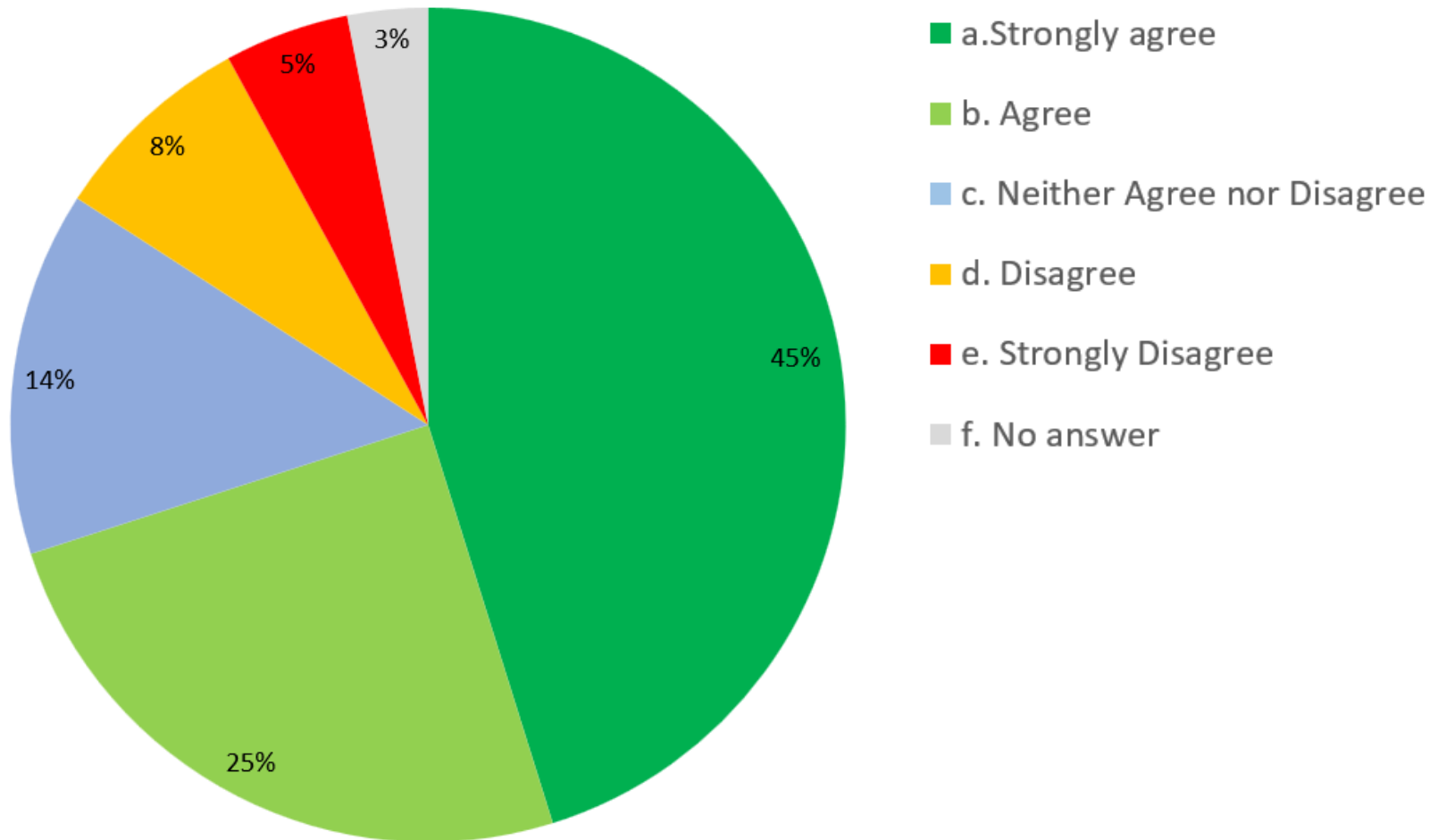
Q3 - The Open Space should remain designated for free public access with no bunds, but with a permanent path.



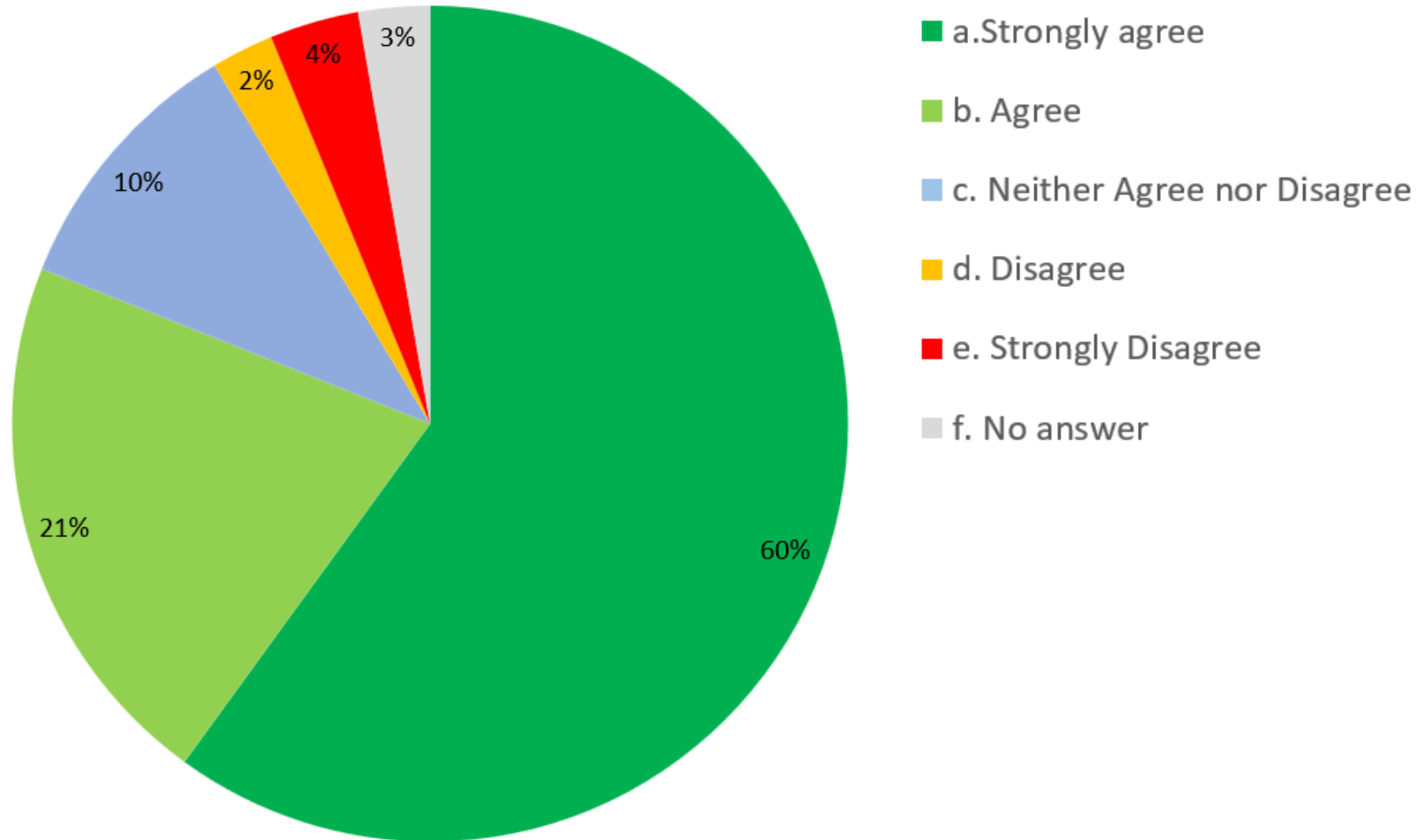
Q4 - Bunds should be created on the Open Space as potential noise mitigation as per the applicant's indicative design.



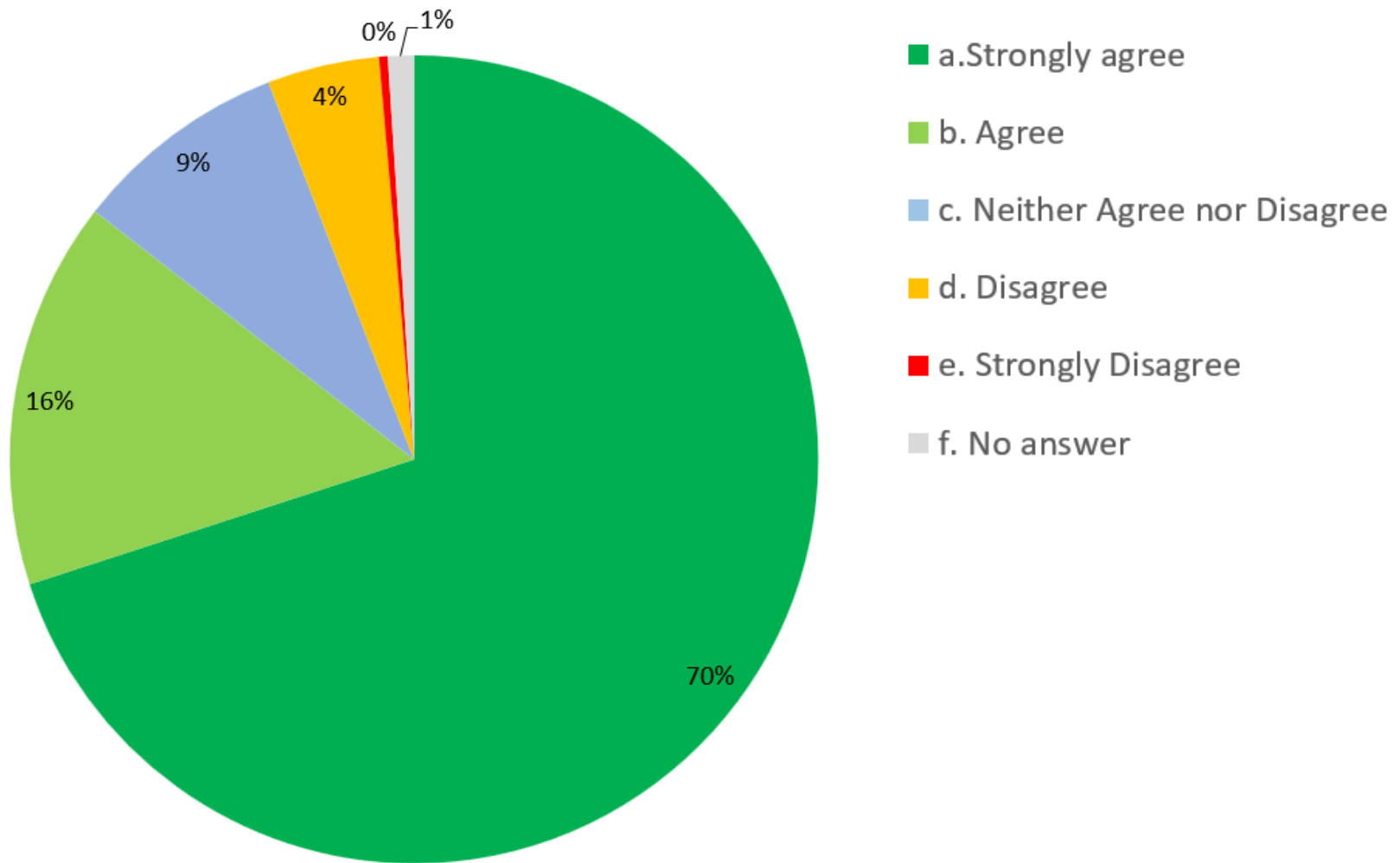
Q5 - The lack of clear visibility on a winding path through and around high bunds would reduce our desire to use the area



Q6 - The current temporary earth storage bund along the edge of Long Plantation should be removed.

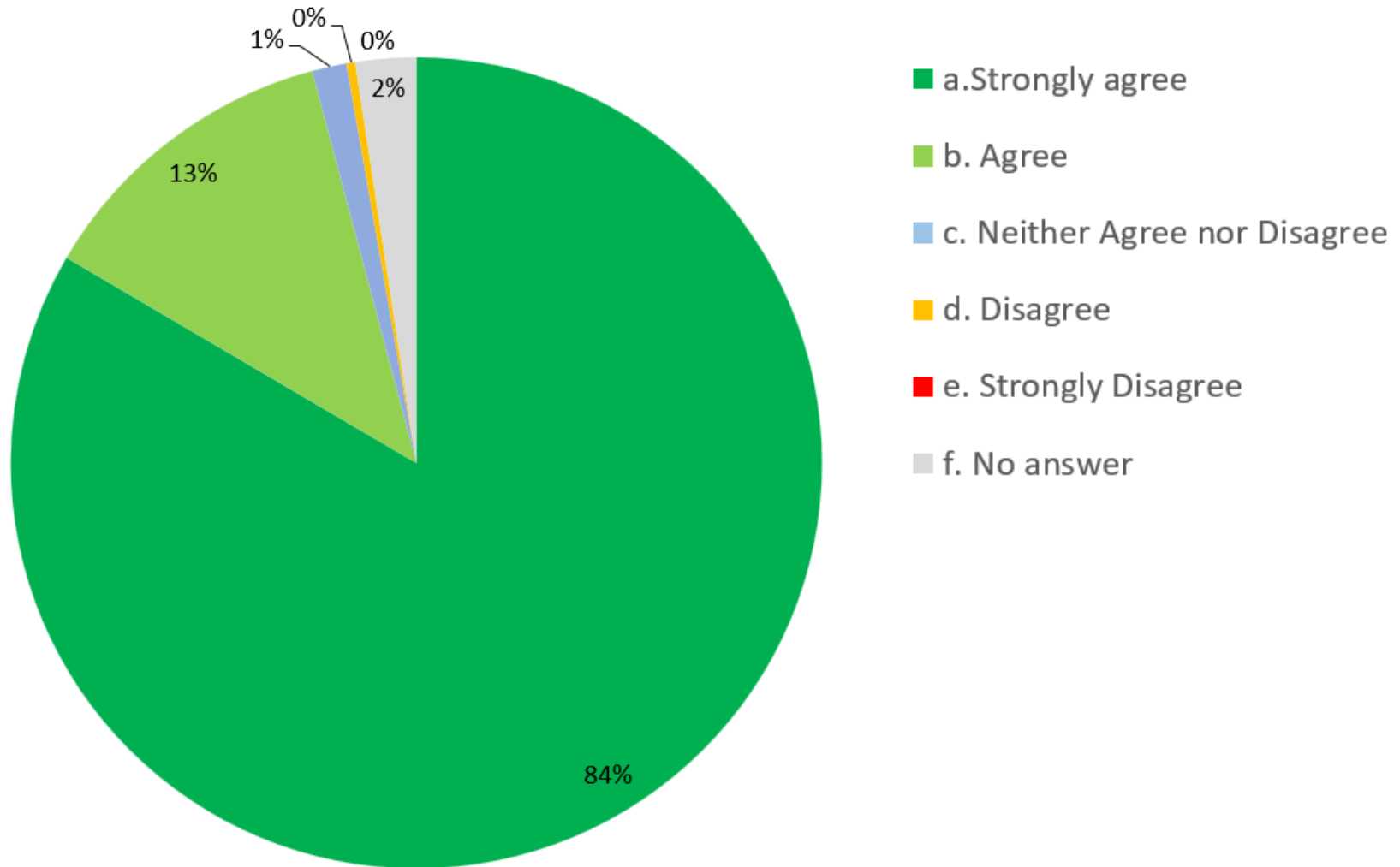


Q7 - The Open Space should be planted with trees to increase the width of Long Plantation.

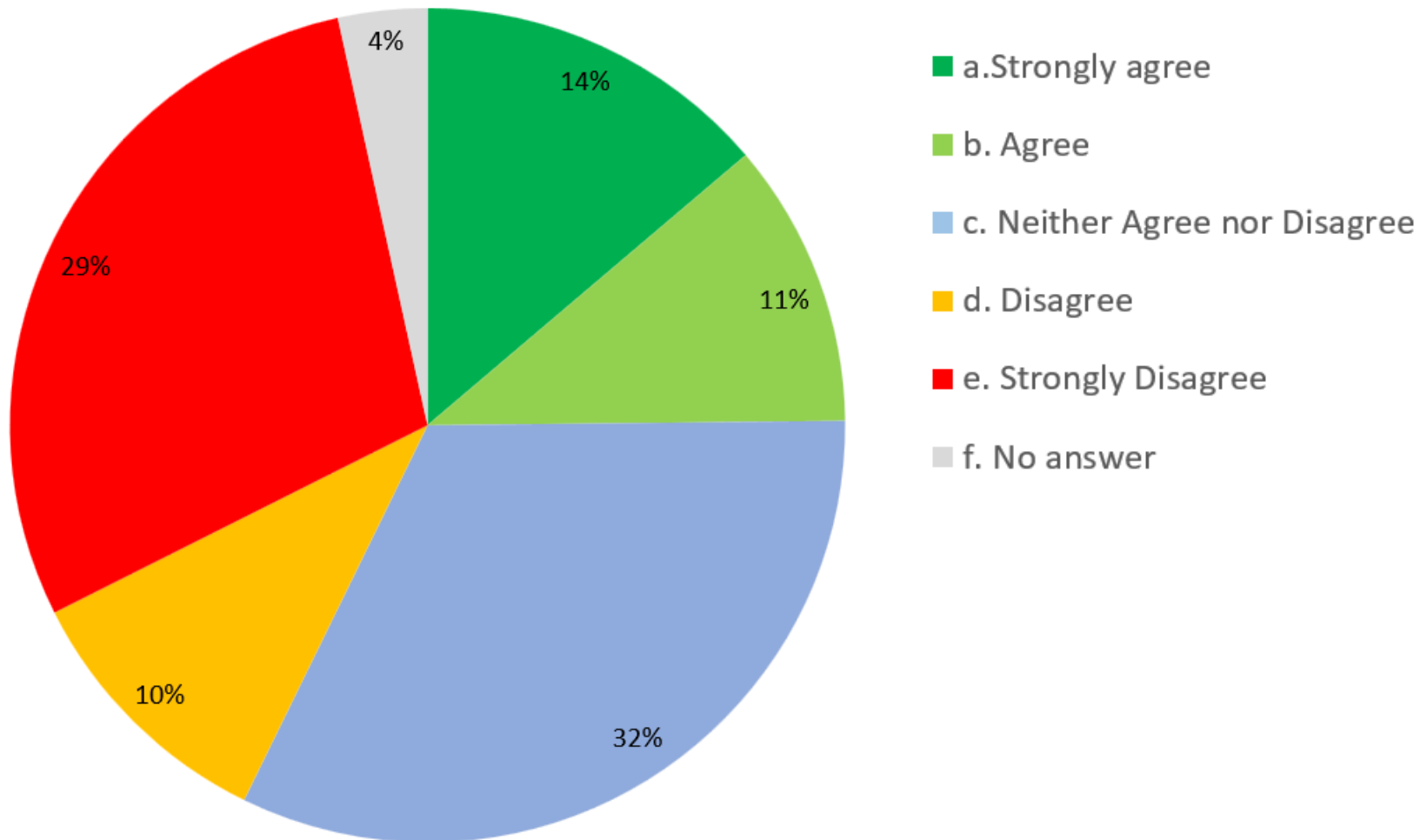




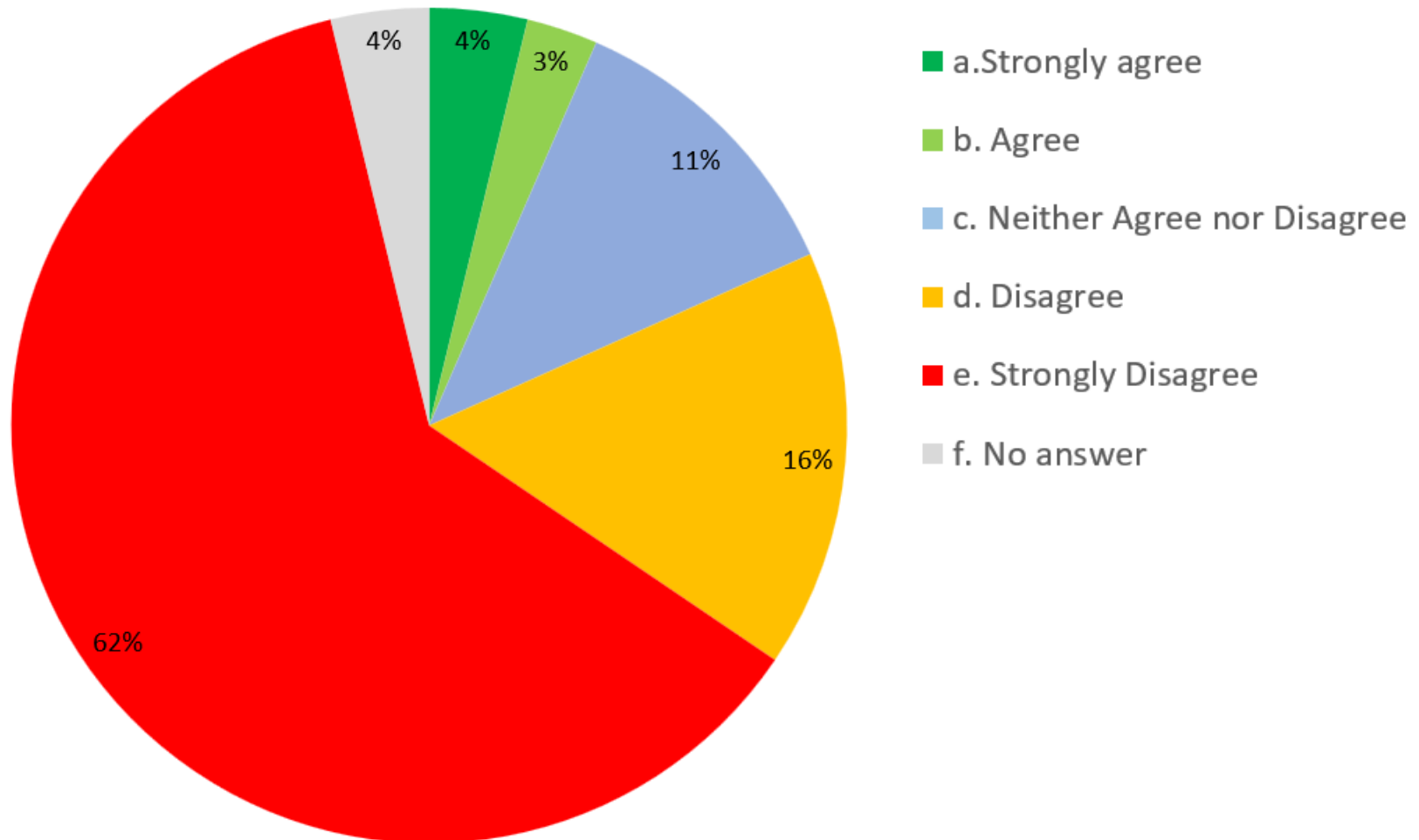
Q8 - The planned acoustic fence should be camouflaged by the planting of trees/shrubs immediately alongside



## Q9 - A new railway station should be established to the south of the 'Amazon' site

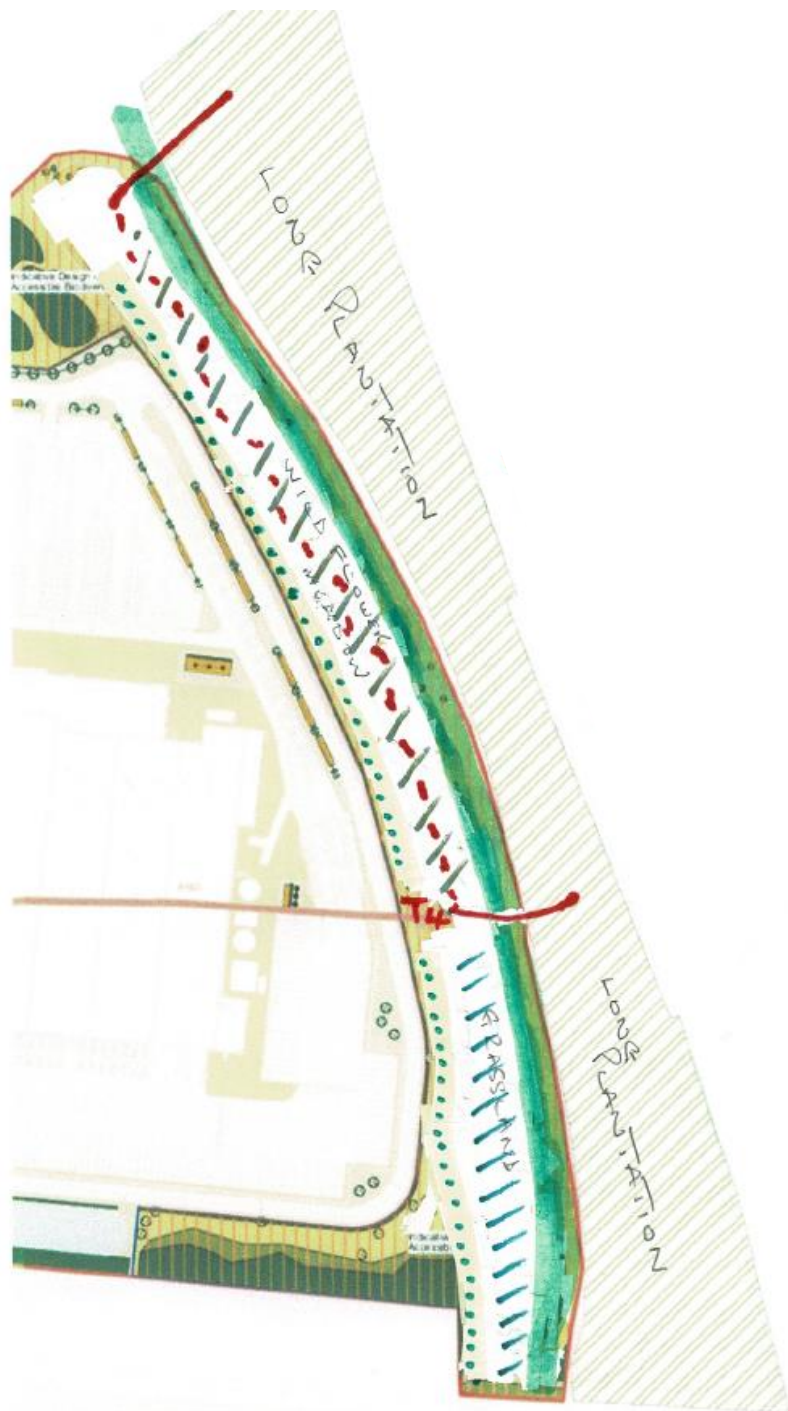


## Q10 - Trees should be removed to provide new vehicular access to the south of Long Plantation



# Key Themes in comments

- Paths
  - YWW is pedestrian access only (no bikes or horses)
  - Natural accessible footpaths – not concrete
  - Free roam environment
- Landscaping
  - No bunds
  - Increase width of Long Plantation (from top to railway)
  - Plant native trees, including some evergreen, along acoustic fence
  - Protect T4
  - Wildflower meadow (above T4)
  - Encourage wildlife to area
