

NORTH FERRIBY WIND FARM COMMUNITY FUND REPORT – YEAR 5

The 4th payment was received in October 2021. The fund was advertised at the end of 2021, with the grants being awarded in February 2022. Inflation increased the payment to £8,3025.50.

The fund's popularity has grown and a total of 8 applications were received with the requests totally over two and a half times the value of the fund. Of the 8 applications considered, 7 awards were made. Details of the successful 2022 applications are shown below.

FERRIBY BROWNIES

Project: Improvements to Brownie Hut

TOTAL PROJECT COST £3,100

GRANT AWARDED £3,100

The project will cover replacing the front door, improving the signage and installing a ramp and making improvements to the railings at the top of the steps

NORTH FERRIBY VILLAGE HALL

Project: Repair and Refurbish Exterior Wall

TOTAL PROJECT COST £4,590

GRANT AWARDED £1,257

This project focuses on improvements to the exterior wall of the Priory Room and Green Room to ensure the integrity of the building.

FERRIBY SOCIAL CLUB

Project: Installation of electric radiators

TOTAL PROJECT COST £3,600

GRANT AWARDED £1,257

This project is a continuation of the work started last year and involves installing more electric radiators to ensure a warm and hospitable environment.

NORTH FERRIBY CRICKET CLUB

Project: Upgrade to Training Facility

TOTAL PROJECT COST £910

GRANT AWARDED £690

The grant was requested funds to purchase a Turf Spiker for the wicket and a boundary rope (not funded).

ANNE TURNER MEMORIAL ALLOTMENT COMMITTEE

Project: Pump House Refurbishment

TOTAL PROJECT COST £897

GRANT AWARDED £897

The structure around the water pump is badly in need of repair.

HEDGEHOG RESCUE & REHABILITATION

Project: Grant towards ongoing running costs

TOTAL PROJECT COST £843

GRANT AWARDED £100

The funds were requested to keep providing a refuge for injured and sick hedgehogs from the local area. Funds to be spent on medication and food for the hedgehogs.

MEN IN SHEDS

Project: Container with electricity

TOTAL PROJECT COST £4,674

GRANT AWARDED £1,000

There is insufficient space in the Pavillion for Men in Sheds group to carry out all its desired activities. The grant awarded is to provide seed funding for a larger project to create a dedicated building for a workshop.
