NORTH FERRIBY WIND FARM COMMUNITY FUND REPORT – YEAR 7

The 6th payment was received in August 2023. The fund was advertised at the end of 2023, with the grants being awarded in February 2024. Inflation increased the payment to £9,491.57.

The fund's popularity remains strong, a total of 9 applications were received with the requests totalling around twice the value of the fund. Of the 9 applications considered, 7 awards were made. Details of the successful 2024 applications are shown below.

NORTH FERRIBY PRIMARY SCHOOL

Project: Roots and Shoots - Bluey's Allotment

TOTAL PROJECT COST £9,734

GRANT AWARDED £2,000

Creation of an allotment on the school grounds to support the learning activities for the school children, especially those with high level SEN needs.

NORTH FERRIBY VILLAGE HALL

Project: External Repairs

TOTAL PROJECT COST £2,592

GRANT AWARDED £2,592

This project is to cover the replacement of the flat roof between the Main Hall and the Priory Room to ensure the integrity of the building, as currently the building is leaking and repairs to the existing roof are no longer possible.

FERRIBY HERITAGE TRUST

Project: Promote the Bronze Age Boats

TOTAL PROJECT COST £3,500

GRANT AWARDED £2,000

This project will fund the expansion and maintenance of the website and provide a new cover for the half scale replica boat to protect it during storage.

NORTH FERRIBY CRICKET CLUB

Project: Improving Social Catering Facilities

TOTAL PROJECT COST £1175.79

GRANT AWARDED £975

The grant was requested to help fund the replacement of the current refrigeration units which enables the club to provide food and drink during matches.

ANNE TURNER MEMORIAL ALLOTMENT COMMITEE

Project: Water Butt replacement project

TOTAL PROJECT COST £2,929.50

GRANT AWARDED £976.00

The project is to replace the 3 water butts on the allotment site with new covered and raised units with drainage taps enabling the butts to be fully emptied over winter and cleaned when required.

HEDGEHOG RESCUE & REHABILITATION

Project: Grant towards ongoing running costs

TOTAL PROJECT COST £1,221.41

GRANT AWARDED £100

The funds were requested to keep providing a refuge for injured and sick hedgehogs from the local area. Funds to be spent on medication and food for the hedgehogs.

FERRIBY SHED

Project: Installation of access path

TOTAL PROJECT COST £1271.20

GRANT AWARDED £1,000

During the winter months access to the Pavilion is restricted dur to the very muddy conditions of the field. The grant awarded is to provide a new path from the car park to the pavilion.
