NORTH FERRIBY WIND FARM COMMUNITY FUND REPORT – YEAR 8

The 7th payment was received late, in January 2025, which meant that the money was not awarded until April 2025. Inflation increased the payment to £10,317.34.

The fund's popularity remained strong, a total of 9 applications were received with the requests totalling just under twice the value of the fund. All 9 of the applications considered received awards. Details of the successful 2025 applications are shown below.

NORTH FERRIBY VILLAGE HALL

Project: Roof Repairs

TOTAL PROJECT COST £3,905.83

GRANT AWARDED £2,420

This project is to cover the replacement of the ridge tiles on the main hall roof to ensure the integrity of the building.

NORTH FERRIBY RIDING FOR THE DISABLED

Project: Stable Repairs

TOTAL PROJECT COST £3,600

GRANT AWARDED £1,700

This project is to cover repairs to the timber stable block, specifically re-roofing and weather proofing the rear of the stables which currently leak.

NORTH FERRIBY AND SWANLAND SCOUT GROUP

Project: Replacement door to Scout Headquarters

TOTAL PROJECT COST £3,288

GRANT AWARDED £1,700

This project will fund the replacement of the main double doors into the Scout Headquarters that are in desperate need of repair as they swell in winter, making it hard to open and close..

NORTH FERRIBY CRICKET CLUB

Project: New Sightscreens

TOTAL PROJECT COST £1,750

GRANT AWARDED £1,700

The grant was requested to purchase a new modern sightscreen to replace the existing old screens that are in need of repair and very heavy to manoeuvre.

ANNE TURNER MEMORIAL ALLOTMENT COMMITEE

Project: Green Energy Project

TOTAL PROJECT COST £3,406

GRANT AWARDED £1700

The aim of the project is to install solar panels to provide on-site power to run the lawn mowers, hedge trimmers and brush cutters.

HEDGEHOG RESCUE & REHABILITATION

Project: Grant towards ongoing running costs

TOTAL PROJECT COST £1,041.27

GRANT AWARDED £250

The funds were requested to keep providing a refuge for injured and sick hedgehogs from the local area. Funds to be spent on medication and food for the hedgehogs.

FERRIBY SHED

Project: Installation of access path

TOTAL PROJECT COST £1,060.80

GRANT AWARDED £500

This grant awarded is to extend the path that was created last year, to cover between the workshop and the pavilion.

BIRD FEEDING

Project: Daily feeding of birds in the Riverside Walkway

TOTAL PROJECT COST £480

GRANT AWARDED £250

The funds were requested to keep providing bird seed and nuts on a daily basis in the Enchanted Woodland area of the Riverside Walkway.

NORTH FERRI-BEE FRIENDLY VILLAGE GROUP

Project: Creation of Wildflower meadows

TOTAL PROJECT COST £572

GRANT AWARDED £250

The project aims to promote wildflowers across North Ferriby. Funds will be spent on creation of seed bank and plant swap table at the RDA café and carrying out wildflower seed sewing.

Following the allocation of the grants the Parish Council was informed that a grant allocated in 2024 to the Ferriby Heritage Trust was no longer required and in May it was agreed by the Council to reallocate these funds in 2026.
