- 15. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE Councillors Richardson and Wood submitted apologies.

19. CLERK'S REPORT

- 19.1. Monthly Report The Clerk reported that TCV had been booked to carry out Reed Pond clearance work on 11 and 12 October. It was agreed that Cllr Dennett and the Clerk would review the state of the bus stops and timetable information provided and feedback to the Transportation Services at ERYC. It was noted that the Dog Warden had put up more stickers around the village, that the new litter bin had been installed at the far end of the Riverside Walkway and that the Lifebuoy from the Humber Road car park had been found by a resident on the foreshore and had been replaced in its storage box.
- 19.2. The current financial report was reviewed. No concerns were raised.

20. OTHER MATTERS

- **20.1. Village Task Force visit** On 7th July Cllrs Black and Dennett accompanied an ERYC officer on a review of the village. Cllr Dennett gave a report of the visit and from the prepared list of items it was noted which actions ERYC agreed to followed up.
- **20.2.** Coronation Garden Trees It was noted that planning approval had been received to remove the trees in Coronation Gardens that are damaging the wall. Three quotations for removing the trees and grinding the stumps had been received and these were reviewed. It was **Resolved** that the contract for removing the trees and grinding out the stumps would be given to Wold Trees at the cost of £830 + VAT.
- **20.3. Work to Coronation Gardens Wall** It was agreed that the Clerk would ask both contractors to liaise directly with each other to plan the works and to ensure that they took place during the summer holidays. Copies of liability insurance and risk assessments will be requested from both parties before work commences.
