- 21. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE Cllrs Richardson submitted apologies.
- **22. DECLARATIONS OF PECUNIARY OR NON-PECUNIARY INTEREST –** There were no declarations.
- **23. MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 7 NOVEMBER 2022 Resolved –** that the minutes be approved as a correct record and signed by the Vice Chairman.
- 24. PUBLIC FORUM There was no public speaking.

25. CLERK'S REPORT

- 25.1. Monthly Report The Clerk reported that the new grit bins had been installed and that £240 had been reclaimed from the insurance company dealing with the damaged bin on Low Street. It was also noted that the grit bin on Marine Avenue had been hit by a car over Christmas, but that it had not sustained any permanent damage. It was noted that a new gate had been installed on the Ings Lane entrance of the footpath to the Reed Pond and that a new volunteer had signed up to litter picking on Ferriby High Road. Finally, it was agreed that the new shrubs in Coronation Gardens would be pruned in February.
- **25.2.** The current financial report was reviewed. No concerns were raised.

26. OTHER MATTERS

- **26.1.** National Lottery Grant The request from the National Lottery on how the grant had been spent was discussed, and it was noted that arrangements had been made with TCV to book the tree clearance work from 23- 25th October, with the invoice being paid in advance in order to meet the grant timeframe.
- **26.2. Riverside Walkway** The damage to the track at the far end of the Riverside Walkway was noted and it was agreed that SJK Garden Services would be asked to repair the damage. It was also agreed to replace the missing padlock at a cost of £50.
- **26.3. Queen's Green Canopy** It was noted that all the hazel trees gifted by Mires Beck have been planted in the Enchanted Woodland and it was agreed that the site would be visited after the meeting to determine the position for the plaque.
- **26.4. Dog Fouling** Four different stencil designs were discussed and it was agreed to purchase two 'Bag it Bin it' pavement stencils and yellow spray paint to prevent dog fouling, at a cost of £60.
