- 44. REPORT FROM THE CONSERVATION SOCIETY - The Chairman of Ferriby Conservation Society presented a book to the Parish Council that he had written called North Ferriby Village Trusts that documented all the history of the land and buildings that had been left in trust to the Village. He went on to explain that the Conservation Society was formed in 1986 in response to a planning application made on Ings Field. Unfortunately in the last few years no volunteers have come forward to take over the running of the society, so the decision has been taken to fold it. According to the constitution, the remaining assets of £688.55 were presented to the Parish Council, with the request that the money be spent on the Riverside Walkway.

45. **CLERK'S REPORT**

- 45.1 Planning Committee review of the Energy from Waste Plant - The Clerk reported the basis for the objection made to the application and the decision taken by the ERYC Planning Committee to agree to the establishment of a Liaison Committee and to defer the decision until the section 106 agreement has been written, after which point the application will be approved. The Clerk also reported that she had been in discussions with UKWIN (UK Without Incineration Network) and they had suggested that the call-in process could be used. This was discussed and it was agreed that further information was required before a decision could be taken. If required it was agreed that an extraordinary meeting would be called. - 50.2 The Trustees approved the payment of invoices as detailed in Minute No. PC 18-52
- 50.3 The Trustees considered the 3 quotations for upgrading the CTTV system and installing a new camera at the skate park. It was **Resolved** that the existing supplier Delta Securities is awarded the contract at a total cost of £5907 + VAT with 50% of the funding being provided by the commuted sum. The Trustees also noted the additional project that will be funded by the commuted sum to introduce inclusive play equipment to the park and agreed with the recommendation of the Playing Field Committee that the cheapest quotation should be accepted from Streetscape at a cost of £14840 + VAT. In total these two projects utilise all of the commuted sum funding allocated for children. Proposed by Councillor Abraham and seconded by Councillor Swindin.
- 50.4 The Trustees were informed that the Charity Commission has made changes to the Trustee Automatic Disqualification Rules and there is a new form to be completed.
