40th ANNIVERSARY OF RIVERSIDE WALKWAY

At the end of this year, it is 40 years since the Parish Council acquired the land that is now Riverside Walkway. To commemorate the occasion a number of events will be held in late 2026/2027 and we will provide more details over time.



The first event will be held in the Village Hall over the weekend of 5th- 6th December, 11.00 a.m. – 2.00 p.m. on both days, when we will be displaying documents, photographs and showing film footage of how the area has changed since 1986. We have a guest speaker to launch the event to set the project in context. Come along and find out more about your community heritage.

We are also working on plans for a larger outdoor event during the summer of 2027 to be held on the Riverside Walkway, more details will follow.

– NEW BENCHES PROPOSED TO HELP ENABLE WALKING –



The Parish Council recognises that there are large distances between benches around the village and that more availability of places to rest a while may enable some residents to get out for fresh air and exercise. We are therefore seeking the agreement of East Riding Council to site three additional benches at the Nunburnholme Avenue crossroads, on the green space on Narrow Lane between the barriers and on the corner of Corby Park and Nunburnholme Avenue. In response to residents' concerns, it is also hoped to locate a new litter bin near to the latter.

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– AT THE PLAYING FIELDS –

The Playing Field Committee has recently installed two new benches for everyone to enjoy.

The first is located just outside the play area and is ideal for those visiting with dogs. It allows you to keep your dog outside the park while still having a clear view of children using the play equipment. The second is a picnic table positioned in the shade of the trees on the playing field – perfect for relaxing and staying cool during the hot, sunny days we've experienced this summer. A special thank you to Shaun for all his hard work in installing these.



The Committee is also working on a project to invest commuted sum funding from the Beal housing development to enhance the playing field. If any young people have ideas of what they would like to see in the play area or elsewhere on the field, can they please contact the Clerk.

Finally, unfortunately due to the dry weather we have experienced this summer, the new football pitches being created as part of the Beal housing development on the far side of the playing field will not be ready for use until summer 2027.



TRANSWASTE COMMUNITY LIAISON GROUP

A representative from the Parish Council attended a recent meeting of the TCLG and key points discussed were as follows:



Wind turbines: Two new turbines are now installed. One will supply the Smith & Nephew building; customers for the second and a planned third turbine are still undecided. Transwaste is expected to make Windfarm Fund money available this year.

Anaerobic Digester: The plant is operational but currently running at about 30% of its intended capacity.

Energy from Waste: Transwaste has not yet decided the plant's size, but a decision is expected soon due to grid connection deadlines.

Odours: The Environment Agency was present and asked that the residents be reminded to report odour complaints on the EA Hotline 0800 807060.

– RECENT COMMUNITY SAFETY INCIDENTS –

At July's Parish Council meeting we heard from PCSO Jess who attended at our request. We had a full and frank discussion about recent events in the community which are of concern to our residents. Humberside Police explained that residents can help by reporting incidents directly to the Police, ideally while they are happening or as soon as possible afterwards.

Police do not monitor social media, so rather than posting online, it would be far more effective for residents to report incidents to the authorities. Contrary to what many people may think, all reports are taken seriously and help Police identify patterns, which can lead to increased patrols and monitoring. And of course, if a crime is taking place, you should call 999 for quicker assessment and response.

How to Contact the Police:

Emergency: Call 999 if there is immediate danger, a crime in progress or the threat of violence.

Non-Emergency: Call 101 or report online via <https://www.humberside.police.uk>.

Anonymous Reporting: Call Crimestoppers at 0800 555 111.

– EAST RIDING LOCAL PLAN –

The East Riding Local Plan Update was finalised in 2025, setting out the amount and type of development planned across the area. However, the Government has since increased housing targets, meaning the East Riding must now plan for an additional 900 homes each year.

Work is therefore underway on a new Local Plan, which is expected to cover 2029/30 to 2044/45. The Parish Council is actively engaging with the process, which is due to begin by 31 October 2026 and is expected to take around 30 months through to adoption.

Under changes to the planning system, potential development sites will not be formally allocated until the later stages of the process. In the meantime, land submitted through the Call for Sites process can be viewed, but each site will be assessed against the emerging planning policies before any decision is made on whether it should be included for development.

The Parish Council will keep residents informed about future consultation stages and opportunities to have their say.
