- 46. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE** – Cllr Holborn submitted apologies
- 47. DECLARATIONS OF PECUNIARY OR NON-PECUNIARY INTEREST** – There were none
- 48. MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 23 FEBRUARY 2026– Resolved** – that the minutes be approved as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.
- 49. PUBLIC FORUM** - There was no public speaking
- 50. CLERK’S REPORT**
- 50.1. Monthly Report** – The Clerk informed the committee that the Station Adoption safety briefing had been successfully completed and the group was now able to start work at the Station. The group will now need to meet and agree an action plan. It was noted that the memorial plaque discussed at the last meeting will be installed shortly. Work has been undertaken by ERYC to improve the footpath in Long Plantation.
- 50.2.** The year end financial position was reviewed. No concerns were raised.
- 51. OTHER MATTERS**
- 51.1. Humber Road Car Park** – The feedback following the installation of the ‘No Overnight Parking’ signs were introduced was discussed, but it was agreed that the signs should stay and the advertising of the area on a website as a suitable place for camper vans to stay, should be removed.
- 51.2. Flags** – It was agreed that two Union Jack flags and one Yorkshire Flag should be purchased. The arrangements for flying the St George flag at the war memorial site were also agreed.
- 51.3. Reed Pond** – It was agreed that the quote provided by Aquatic Solutions Ltd of £1,475 + VAT for carrying out reed cutting by boat would be accepted and that the adjacent landowner would be asked to provide the required access. Once dates are confirmed then TCV will be booked to help with the Reed Pond work if necessary, and will be booked for 2 days of woodland clearance work.
- 51.4. Coronation Gardens** – It was agreed that new plants would be purchased for Coronation Gardens, with the expenditure not exceeding the budget of £100.
- 51.5. Know Your North Ferriby Event** – Unfortunately no one signed up to water the new verge trees at the event, but it was agreed that a few residents would be approached directly to see if they could help. It was also noted that good collaboration was had with the school regarding the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Riverside Walkway project.
- 51.6. 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Riverside Walkway** – The Clerk shared the original plans for the site that had been provided by one of the original members of the Riverside Walkway committee. It was also agreed that the community would be asked if they can help design the logo for the project and that this should be advertised via Facebook.
- 51.7. Village Walk** – It was agreed that the Village Walk, focusing on the Riverside Walkway, will take place at 9.30am on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> April.
